TWO MINUTES

Luke 7:36-50

When Jesus went to eat with Simon the Pharisee, a woman came to him, washed his feet with her tears, dried them with her hair and anointed them with perfume. Jesus had a great impact on her life. She knew that she could be forgiven for all she had done. She took her forgiveness seriously! Because her sin was so great, her forgiveness meant so much more.

Other people present looked down on her. We can sometimes think that our sins are not as bad as the next person. Yet we are all in need of forgiveness. Our *attitude* towards others is sometimes the thing we need to look at. Resentment, jealousy, bitterness, discontent, defensiveness or ingratitude can cause disharmony in our marriages or other relationships with family and friends.

Do we take our forgiveness seriously? Are we thankful and appreciative of what our Lord has done for us? Do we bow down and worship our God in grateful adoration as that woman did?

Prayer: Lord we thank you for your great love for us and for your forgiveness. May we worship and adore you and truly appreciate all you have done for us. Amen.

• Today we are continuing our sermon series on **Live who you are**, by looking at "Our Core Values." Do you know we have a set of core values? They are:

We believe God has gifted every Christian for service as a disciple in the Church and in His world. We are committed to structurally empowering lay ministry by nurturing the discovery of each Christian's spiritual gifts for the common good of Christ's body.

We are committed to:

- Supporting all ministries and activities in prayer.
- Being welcoming, open and honest in communication and actions.
- Providing relevant worship centered on Word and Sacrament.
- Building relationships through fellowship with others.

• So, what is a value? Isn't it what you are willing to die for, live for? Isn't it at the basis of all that we do, the non negotiable? Is this how you see the 4 values above? See the Hey, let's talk about the sermon, below.

• Don't forget about the **HEALING SERVICE this morning** (11am in the Worship Centre).

• Last week I saw a preview of the film "**Amazing Grace**". (See the flyer on the Notice Board). I thought it was truly inspiring. It's the story of a young eighteenth century British politician, William Wilberforce, who over two decades fought against the English government to abolish slave trading. It is a story of perseverance and grace. I plan to make a group booking for Friday 27th July. I hope Rev320 and Bakery and many small groups will join the rest of the congregation in coming to this event. Every person who attends this group booking will receive a \$10 DVD discount voucher for "Heart of Soul Surfer" "Seven Days and the Nativity Story". You can book your tickets at our church office. (I plan to preach on the thrust of the film on 15th July and a book based on the film will soon be available from our church library.) Set this evening aside now.

• Don't forget about the **Small group Leaders Meeting next Sunday 11am**. It will continue where we finished with the last Small group Leaders meeting. I also plan to introduce a new resource called "*Introducing God.*"

• I recommend the seminar "**Mission today and tomorrow**" at Angaston on 29/9/07-1/10/07 and the Mental Health Day seminar on 30/6/07 at LLL **Chaplains & Carers' Conference**: relating to and Caring for those with Mental Illness". More information on the Notice Board.

• If you are in a leadership position in our congregation, please keep the 12,13th October free for the (Willow Creek) **Leadership Summit** and the 20th October free for our **Leadership Retreat**.

Hey let's talk about the sermon (Why not use these questions to prepare for the sermon or as discussion starters with a group of friends?)

1. We say that we are committed to prayer, friendliness, worship, and close relationships (in the 4th value), how does that show itself in the life of the congregation?
2. Our school is not mentioned as one of the values? Does that mean it is only incidental to Golden Grove Lutheran Fellowship? Where does the school belong?
3. Like the statement of mission, doesn't the Core Values protect, guide and gives us confidence in what we do? How can we ensure they are better used for these roles?

Last Sunday evening **the thought struck me**: would people who had worshipped in the morning worship again in the evening (at Salt Factory) if I was to preach a different sermon there. Would you? I would be prepared to write 2 sermons a week if this was required.

20th Anniversary Lunch

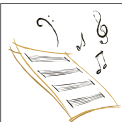
After the 20th anniversary service there will be a lunch so we can enjoy fellowship with each other and have an opportunity to catch up with past members.
