#### Before worship

The Baptism of Jesus

One day Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee, and John baptized him in the Jordan River. As Jesus came up out of the water, he saw the heavens splitting apart and the Holy Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice from heaven said, "You are my dearly loved Son, and you bring me great joy." (Mark 1:9-11)

Jesus' baptism is described in the first three gospels, where John baptises him and the Holy Spirit descends upon the newlybaptised Jesus. While we understand baptism to be a sacrament that removes original sin and sees us adopted by God the Father, it can be puzzling to understand why Jesus allowed himself to be baptised.

We know from the bible that Jesus had no sin that needed to be removed. We also know that he was the eternal Son of God the Father. So baptism for Jesus must mean something different than our own baptism. Jesus' whole incarnation was to deliver us from sin and the ultimate consequences of sin; separation from God. Therefore, his baptism, right at the start of his ministry, is an important part of his work to save us. He is not being forgiven and adopted, rather he is joining us in our sin.

Paul talks about this in Romans 6:4 where he writes 'We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life'. Just as we are joined to Jesus' work of salvation in our baptism, so Jesus joins us by taking upon himself our fallen state when he chooses to be baptised by John. This is another incredible demonstration of God's all-encompassing love for us.

May we always respond to His love and grace with praise and thankfulness.
