
Telling a different story: how Rwandans are healing hatreds and reconciling after genocide.

Devotion

No one likes 'charity'. It is so demeaning for us to have to accept 'handouts' from others. It attacks our self-worth. Often people can feel worthless and their sense of pride can even deter them from seeking help and to think they don't deserve it.

But charity is available and provided for people precisely because of their worth! Our society values human life and individuals and so charitable gifts are offered to ease the load, to help, to show care and not to make people feel guilty and bad.

But it struck a chord with me today, reading from Isaiah:

- V1 'Is anyone thirsty? Come and drink even if you have no money!

 Come take your choice of wine or milk it's all free!
- V7 'turn to the Lord that He may have mercy

Yes turn to our God, for He will forgive generously.'

God's grace could perhaps look like charity too. We want to do things ourselves, provide for ourselves. We don't want a handout from God. Pride may cause us to reject the grace that is offered as 'choice' and 'free'. Perhaps our self-worth has taken a tumble and we are very conscious of our shortcomings and don't want to acknowledge them to ourselves, to others or to God and it becomes difficult for us to see God's offer as something we deserve to receive.

And the point is - we don't deserve it! We never can. We are all human and tarred with sin through and through. But our value is not reduced in God's eyes because of this. He made us, we are His. He still loves us, still wants to help us, to ease our load and show His care. That's why His Son did what He did – giving His own life for us. Not charity that will destroy our selfworth but grace that can fully restore it as we see just how much we are worth to God.

All praise to You Holy God of inestimable worth for You show us by Jesus' dying breath how much You love us. Help us to be humble and take hold of Your love that it may change our hearts to see clearly our value and the value of each and every other person who has been made in Your image. In Jesus' name, Amen.
