Before Worship...

God has raised the Lord Jesus from death, but He won't stop there. His dynamic power will raise us up from the grips of death as well – 1 Corinthians 6:14 (VOICE).

God is calling after our hearts. He calls us to follow Him at all costs. He calls us to believe in His all-conquering power (even through death), and understand that same power applies to whatever we face in our lives today. Wow, we truly do have a special God. I never thought I'd quote Oprah Winfrey, but here's a timely reminder. "There's a calling for all of us. Every human being has value and purpose. The real work of our lives is to become aware. And awakened. To answer the call".

While Samuel was assisting Eli, God began to speak to him, leaving him unaware and confused. It took Samuel four times, with Eli's help, to understand that God was calling after his heart and life directly, to which Samuel simply replied: "Speak, your servant is listening" (1 Samuel 3:10b, NLT). When God calls us, we ought to have our hands and feet ready to move for Him, whatever the cost.

Nathaniel declared after Jesus called him to become a disciple: "Rabbi, you are the Son of God - the King of Israel!" (John 1:49, NLT). Jesus tells Nathaniel that he will see greater things through God's call on his life: a promise that is true for us also.

Finally, we have to remember Paul's remarks in 1 Corinthians 6 (NIV), as he reminds us that our bodies are temples of Christ bought at a price and that the only way for us to respond to His call is to act according to God's plan. "I have the right to do anything, you say—but not everything is beneficial. I have the right to do anything—but I will not be mastered by anything" (1 Corinthians 6:12, NIV).

May you continually be called to act for God's purpose throughout your lives, until you're called home. Amen.

Pastor's Column

All you need is love, Fearfully and wonderfully made, Everyone is doing it..... slogans, slogans, slogans... they are so often used these days and they can make such an impact on us. We might even find ourselves living by some of them. But have we thought through those slogans that bombard us?

The people in Corinth in Paul's time, had their favourite slogans: *Food for the stomach and the stomach for food and God will destroy them both, I have the right to do anything* which Paul had to confront the Corinthians about.

He encourages them - and us, to think **deeper and wider** about those slogans.

The text for this morning address is **1 Corinthians 6:12-20**- the second reading for today.

We are actually looking at this text under the title, "**The responsibility of freedom**".

The slogans we adhere to can give us indication of how we use our freedom. Let's explore this thought by means of those slogans we use - some good and some not so good...

Remember **NO Salt Factory Services, Sunday evening dinners** or "**Reaching Out Through prayer**" this month. (We had a family turn up last Sunday night for Salt Factory)

I am still trying to hunt down some **keys to our church plant**. If you have a key that you have no reason to have anymore (ie. You have no need to assess the church plant when there is no one else around to open it for you) please hand it back before I approach you.

I am still approaching people to **join one of the rosters** where you see the same people coming up time and time again - in particular Prayer. (Again please feel free to see me before I approach you for this.)

Thank you so much for all those who were involved in the cook off last Saturday and the working bee yesterday. Well done guys.

Starting in February the theme as we prepare for Easter is "**Before Amen**". We'll be looking a prayer.

The title "Before Amen" is taken from Max Lucado latest book which is in the church library. In the book Bill expands on what he calls the pocket prayer: a short hand version of the Lord's Prayer.

I am planning to make public by answer to the Calls I have received today.

Outside:

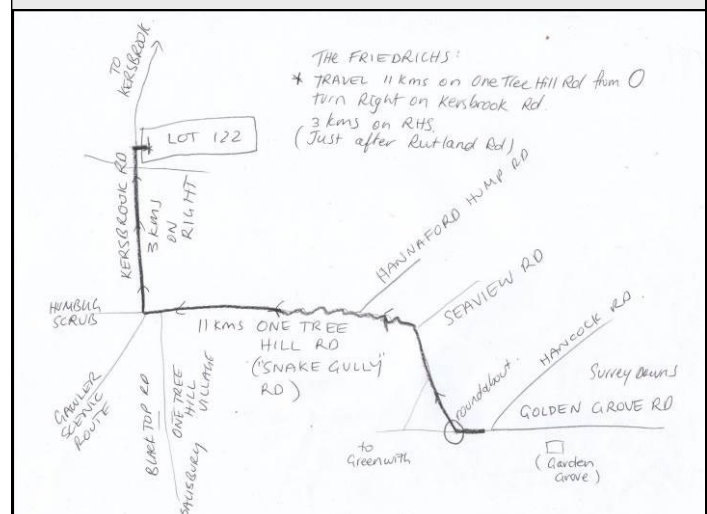
- Chop down small burnt trees
- Cut up burnt timber for firewood
- Move twigs/ branches
- Remove small fences
- Rebuild vege garden beds and fence
- Collect up scrap metal, burnt plastic etc
- Replace posts on some fences
- Move hay into shed
- Rake up mulch in garden areas
- Move some charcoal /burnt bits
- Dig trenches for water pipes

Inside:

- Clean windows
 - Squirt down outside walls and paving
 - Wipe down /vacuum walls inside
 - Clean floors
 - Take down curtains for dry cleaning. (Fix curtain hem!)
- Please bring (for your own use) if you have any of the following:**

- 4WD with trailers
- Wheelbarrows, axes, chainsaws, choppers, splitters
- Picks, shovels, rakes, trenching tools
- Pliers, hammers, side-cutters
- High pressure water sprayers
- Window squeegee thingys
- Gloves, solid shoes, hat, sunscreen, goggles/ear plugs if working with chainsaws.

Here is a message from our Worship team:

"I have thought about being on the prayer roster but I don't know how to write the prayers . . . It looks too hard. . .!" Does that sound like you? We could really use your help. It's easier than you think. Just start and watch as God gives you more than there is time to pray for!

Every week Pastor sends out worship notes for the coming Sunday. Usually the basis of the worship order, the readings, sometimes songs and a draft of the sermon are included. Reading these early in the week helps to prepare your heart and it is never too early to ask God for guidance in what to focus on.

News events during the week, local and world wide, members who are sick and any congregational needs can all be included. Asaroka and our school are the two main missions we pray for regularly. Including scripture from the readings of the day or especially from the Psalms can help. The LCA website has prayer resources and there are also some in our church library that can kick start the process.

Be yourself. Say it in your style! Trust in God, asking that He will bring things to your mind at each stage. Read it aloud at home a few times so you are happy with the phrasing. Time it, 5 - 6 minutes is all that is required.

Be prepared to add an extra petition on the day if someone has a special need. They or Pastor will let you know. On the morning, make sure you see Pastor before the service and assure him you have prepared the prayers.

Relax, enjoy the insights you receive, worship and pray through the whole process. Even when you get nervous it's still worth doing. You learn so much yourself and what a blessing to be able to bring the needs of the world and the needs of our Brothers and Sisters in Christ right to the throne of God on their behalf. Give it a try!
