When a Band-Aid won't do the job...

The Palm Sunday story is known well – for many of us, we have heard it each year since our infancy: Jesus rides triumphantly into Jerusalem on a donkey, with the people shouting "Hosanna! Hosanna!" These simple people were expecting Jesus to rise up as king, and save them from all of their present troubles. But, as we know - the chief priests and teachers had other ideas which were revealed over the next few days.

However, what was at the heart of God's plan, was a very different agenda. Yes – Jesus would reign for ever and ever, but His kingdom was not of our world.

God knew that simply saving us from the trouble of today, would not benefit us for eternity. It would be like trying to put a little Band-Aid on a gaping hole. And yet, how often do we still seek this... "Please God, save me from today, oh, and give me tomorrow." Our daily whims change – like the expression of the crowd – Hosanna! today and Crucify! tomorrow.

God, our Father, knew that we needed a long-term solution, and it came with a price: the life of His one and only Son, in exchange for our eternal salvation.

They say that sometimes you don't realise what you have until you lose it. Jesus was with these people every day – they could have asked him questions, learnt so much more from him, and yet it was not until he was taken from them that the people could reflect on their wasted opportunity.

What about you? Is Jesus part of a Band-Aid cure, or a long term commitment? Only you can decide.

Lenten Appeal - There is still time! Help us reach our goal of lighting 1,500 Candles before Easter




At Lutheran Community Care our staff walk daily with people through their dark
