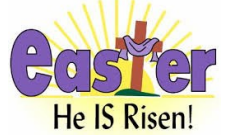

Greetings to any visitors here with us. We are pleased to have you join us and we trust you have felt welcomed and pray the Holy Spirit may enlighten and empower us with the message shared with us today.

Before worship

I encourage you now to get your Bible's out and read Acts 3:12-19, 1 John 3:1-7 and Luke 24:36-48 for yourself. Find a place somewhere quiet and reflect carefully on what you are reading. Maybe once you have finished reading it talk to someone close to you about how God spoke to you from reading the scripture. Below are some key points I had taken from the texts that I got out of reading them.

From reading the scripture in Acts we read that God raised Jesus from the dead (which is what we celebrate on Easter Sunday and for the seven weeks that follow) although he was killed by man (Acts 3:15). We also read that through Him we are healed! Therefore, we need to repent our sins and turn to God, and our sins may be wiped out. We are then refreshed from the Lord (Acts 3:18).

In John we read that we are the children of God and that is what we are (John 3:1). He appeared through Jesus to take away our sins as in Him there is no sin (John 3:4).

In Luke we read that Jesus appeared to His disciples and said "peace be with you" (Luke 24:36) as they were frightened to see Him there. To demonstrate that He was there with them in the flesh he ate a broiled fish (Luke 24:42).

I feel we all need to regularly refresh ourselves of the truth by reading God's word for what it is. Read what God has already done for us, what he is doing for us and what he is going to do for us in the future as it is written in the scripture.

Dear God, thank you for life and your word that you have given to us so that we can grow stronger in our relationship with you. Please be with us as we try to live simply and look for answers from your word instead of over complicating life by looking for answers elsewhere. All our hope and trust is in you. Your will be done in our lives. In your name we pray, Amen.

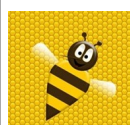

Volunteers Needed across LCC

Barossa:

- **Tax Help** - Help others in the community complete basic tax returns. No experience is necessary and full training will be provided by the ATO. We are in need of someone for a minimum of four hours per week from 1 July - 31 October at our Tanunda site. Contact the ATO directly at 08 8208 1126 or contact Margaret at LCC by calling 08 8562 2688. You can also search the Tax Help Program on the ATO website.

Blair Athol Op Shop:

- Volunteers are needed at the Blair Athol **Op Shop** for the following tasks:
- moving stock (will require people who are physically capable of lifting heavy items, a couple hours each week or on a needs basis)
- maintenance of garden (on a needs basis)
- driving van to pick up and deliver stock (current Driver's Licence required).

Blair Athol Emergency Relief:

- **Emergency Relief Workers** - work 1 day per week (9.00am-3.00pm) interviewing and assessing people who visit for assistance. Computer skills are essential but specific training is provided.
- **Cooking Class Volunteers** - work one Monday per month (10.30am-1.00pm) helping people with food preparation, cooking skills, and cleaning up when finished. Knowledge of basic recipes is required and you will be working with a maximum of six people per class.

Peachey Place Living Skills Centre, Davoren Park:

- **Cooking Class Leader** - needed on Wednesdays to teach people basic cooking skills. Volunteers can commit to one Wednesday per fortnight or per month if unable to commit every week.
- **Garden Leader** - lead a gardening group on Wednesday and Friday, 10.00am-12.00noon, teaching people to grow their own vegetables. Volunteers can commit to a Wednesday or Friday if unable to volunteer on both days.
