Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day.
 2 Corinthians 4:16

It is a weird concept, two opposite things happening to us at the same time. But quite often when it comes to the Bible, Jesus throws what we think as normal back at us and twists how we view it; Israel's king coming as a child to an outcast family, giving away everything and gaining eternal life, and probably the most obvious, the first being last and the last, first. But Jesus quite often describes himself as opposites, like the Alpha and Omega, or beginning and end. So biblically, outwardly wasting away and inwardly being renewed makes a lot of sense.

So how do opposites help us in our walk with God? We are called to be the opposites. In Romans 12:2, we are called to be transformed instead of conformed, which leads to us being able to test and approve God's perfect will. God often calls those who don't conform, like Noah, David, Daniel and the list goes on, and each of those people are renewed through knowing what they were called to do, God's perfect will. And as our bodies age, we can know that despite what may hold us back on Earth, we are perfect every time God looks at us, as he renews us through his Son.

Now our bodies may be of Earth, and Earth as a whole is imperfect, as sin has tainted it. But Jesus said to his disciples just before he died, to "take heart, I have overcome the world." He has conquered death, and we get to live eternal life with him. How cool is that?

So how will you actively live out being renewed daily, and witness to those around you?

Lord God, Thank you for renewing us constantly. Help us to use our bodies for the purpose that you intended for them, to actively show others that you are our Father. Lead us to your perfect and pleasing will, and call us to be the opposites. Amen.
