Devotion

Death is a horrible reality of life. So much sadness, grief and pain when someone, especially a loved one dies. We can rationalise it more easily if a person has lived a long and fulfilling life or if someone has been suffering for ages but someone in their prime or a young child with plenty of living still to do, that makes us angry. We always seem to need somewhere to lay the blame. Sometimes people even blame God, as if He delights in death.

We know from the Adam and Eve story that death was indeed a grace of God for it meant that mankind, though sinful, would not live eternally in that condition. He had a plan to save the world and it included death. But when death strikes near to home that seems little consolation.

Today in our readings we have Jesus confronted with death - the death of a loved friend, Lazarus. How does He react? Do we expect Him to just blithely accept it as God's plan? No, Jesus is so human! The emotions He expresses in grief are just like ours! He cries. We are told He is very troubled and a deep anger wells in Him.

So how does Jesus respond? He prays! He acknowledges God in this situation, showing the bystanders His faith in action. He prays and then commands that Lazarus should walk again, right out of the grave. I guess we would all want that replayed for our loved ones ... and it will be - in eternal 'time'. Jesus' anger at death - the wages of sin - and at Satan, is so real. That's how God feels about the situation. And Jesus didn't just feel it - He acted on it, for just a few short days later, Jesus fully demonstrated His love for people by giving up His own life on the cross to save us. His death for ours, eternally.

If you are struggling with grief remember Jesus' reactions were just as real as yours. He understands. Take heart at His compassion for Mary and Martha and remember we have Easter and the promise of eternal life - our reality to come.

Manse Appeal and Finance Update

As many would be aware, our congregation's finances are an ongoing point of concern for the Church Council. The figures below represent up to date budgetary figures for the year to date:

Budgeted income for 2015:\$210,000Budgeted income through Sept 2015:\$157,500Actual income through Sept 2015:\$133,221Expenditure through Sept 2015:\$152,815Profit/(Loss) through Sept 2015:\$(19,514)

As you see above, the congregation faces a budget shortfall of almost \$20 000 for the year. This shortfall comes mainly from a reduction over time in the amount of regular giving through weekly offerings and REG (Regular Electronic Giving) that is received by the congregation. The silver lining to the cloud is that at the end of next year we will have paid off the church building which will save us \$45 000 per year which is great news that should be celebrated.

As you will see below, we are now holding a 'Manse Appeal' to raise much needed funds to contribute to the refurbishment of the manse. I ask all who are in the position to do so to be generous with your giving to ensure the continued strength of GGLC.

Manse Appeal

As you would be aware from previous notifications we were looking to borrow from the LLL an amount for urgent work to update the Manse before Pastor Greg & Connie move in at the end of the year. This was passed by the congregation at a meeting after the morning service on Sunday 18th October. Also as previously mentioned we want to raise at least \$10,000 via Congregation Appeal to ensure we have enough to finish the job and keep the borrowing amount down to a minimum. This money will go mainly towards Floor Coverings & Curtains/Blinds. The job needs to be finished by mid December as that is when their furniture will be arriving to be moved in. A builder has now been engaged for the major works. A lot of work has already been done on the outside via Working Bees with more to happen as needed. Thanks so far for your great support here.

We would like the appeal to be run over the next 4 weeks and we ask you to prayerfully consider what you can contribute towards this major project.
