# Before worship...

# The smell of Olives...

The focus of our worship this week is 'the smell of olives' – as we remember how Jesus was tormented in the Garden of Gethsemane.

They say some things are an acquired taste. For me, olives are one of those things – along with dukkah, pickled cucumbers and anchovies. But once the taste is established on your palate, it's a taste you enjoy, and sometimes even crave. However acquiring that taste can be a long and difficult journey – trying a small piece for the first time (so deeply hidden in other foods that it's hardly there at all), all the way through to eating an entire piece, completely unaccompanied.

For many the journey of faith can be like acquiring a 'Taste for God' – step by gradual step, from a very hesitant encounter, to fully accepting Jesus as Lord and Saviour. But once this full commitment to God is made in the heart and mind of every Christian, it is established into your being and you crave opportunities to celebrate your faith, and feel comfortable worshipping in any circumstance.

Just as we crave worship, Jesus craved the opportunity to bring all believers into the true salvation – even though it meant enduring torment and betrayal.

The journey of Jesus acquiring our souls, remembering the smell of Gethsemane through the olives, reminds us of sacrifice before a golden sunrise.

# Pastor's Column

I hope you were given **an olive at the door** as you came to worship.

Today we are taking in **the smell of olives**- not the olives in brine with all the spices, sugar and salt added but fresh olives.

It's the freshness surrounding Jesus' prayer on the Mount of Olives (Matthew 26:36-46) which contrasts with what Jesus is going through, that has got my attention.

The beautiful park, the stillness of the night, the holiday mode of the disciples is in stark contrast with the intense struggle within Jesus' soul.

Doesn't it give a further depth to this episode in Jesus' passion and give us a deeper appreciation of what this all means for us?

I am taking this up **in the morning service** as we take another look (and smell) of the olive grove, the olive tree and olives and how they are used.

And using the same passage to think about the incongruity of life (for instance feeling sad when everyone around is happy) and how we can deal with that at our evening **Salt Factory** worship.

**Next week** on the eve of our Fishing Fete, we'll be using the smell books to think through what it means that Jesus "had the book thrown at him" in both the religious trial and the political trial.

Talking about our **Fishing Fete.** Our congregation is giving out Easter balloons, tracts and a pamphlet on our congregation at the fete. I hope you will join us in the fun of doing this.



I have secured support for another Charter Raffle as a fundraiser for




Asaroka, as part of the **Fishing Fete**. This year

# Step up to Communion for years 3 and 4s as well as year 5s?

One of the requirements that we have put on people to receive Holy Communion at GGLF (including our Friday morning chapel) is that **they know** what they are doing. For this reason we present courses on Holy Communion. The courses we offer children is "Step Up to Communion".

**Step Up to Communion** is a 6 week course. For GGLPS students 3 of those sessions are during school time where we seek to understand Holy Communion ("How does God get his love across?"; "The Mystery" and "The Background") and the second 3 sessions ("Preparation for the meal"; "Repentance" and "Are you serious"?) have been held with parents on a Sunday afternoon. This leads the young person being invited to receive Communion on a regular basis in the Lutheran church. The First Communion occurs soon after that.

Up to this year we have been offering the course to young people in year 5 (about 10 years old) and above. But having read CTICR's (the commission in the Lutheran Church that works through theological issues) presentation on "Infant Communion" I can see no impediment to offering Holy Communion to year 3s and 4s as well. (Even though this document was presented to the General Pastor's Conference last year, it is still in the hands of the Bishops for their blessing and so isn't a public document as yet.)

Also re-reading the Commission on worship's document: Should grape juice be used instead of wine in Holy Communion? (available from me on request), I can't see any good reason why we can't be offering grape juice instead of wine to the children. So I am suggesting that at Friday chapel grape juice will be offered instead of wine.

I am putting this to you for your consideration and discussion. **Please let me know your thoughts.** I intend to offer the Step Up to Communion course in term 2 with First Communion planned for the end of term.
