Greetings to any visitors here with us. We are pleased to have you join us and we trust you have felt welcomed and pray the Holy Spirit may enlighten and empower us with the message shared with us today.

Before worship

I am going to open your graves and <u>bring you back to life</u>...Then you will know that I am the Eternal One. I will breathe My Spirit into you, and you will be alive once again – Ezekiel 37:12-14.

Let's play a game! Describe the Trinity in three words. For me, God = creator, Jesus = friend and the Holy Spirit = guider. It's more than likely that each part of the Trinity will mean something different for you, however. So I encourage you to do this quick activity and remind yourself of it daily.

The Trinity brings us life! God, our creator, gave us original life, and Jesus, our friend and sacrificial lover, gave us new life. But how does the Holy Spirit make us 'come alive'? While I know that the Holy Spirit is the divine wind, I really struggle to understand how the Holy Spirit lives in me. I love the concept, and generally feel the Spirit's guidance, strength and support in my life, but it's difficult to believe. This explanation that's offered by Max Lucado is excellent: "The Holy Spirit is the presence of God in our lives, carrying on the work of Jesus. The Holy Spirit helps us in three directions – inwardly (fruits of the Spirit), upwardly (prayer) and outwardly (God's love in us, shown to others)".

The Spirit of God is at work in all of our lives, and in all three stories today: making us come alive! In the Valley of Dry Bones, God restores life in Ezekiel's prophecy over Israel. God called out: "Dry bones, I will breathe breath into you, and you will come alive" (Ezekiel 37:4b), and they did. The lifeless bones suddenly had tendons, muscles and most importantly, <u>true life</u>! Sometimes, we try and find life in the wrong things, such as material possessions or worldly joys. "A mind focused on the flesh is doomed to death, but a mind focused on the Spirit will find full life and complete peace" (Romans 8:6). <u>Full life</u> and complete peace sound pretty good to me! And Jesus illustrates that death is no barrier to Him or us, as He beautifully raises Lazarus from the dead. Jesus was vulnerable: openly weeping (verse 35) and intensely troubled (38). He was struggling at just the thought of Lazarus' death. But God's Spirit still worked through Him. Jesus proclaims in John 11:25 – "I am the resurrection and the source of <u>all life</u>; those who believe in Me will live even in death".

Prayer: Hey God, thank you that you make us truly come alive. You are our true life, our full life and our source of all life. Help us to remember Your promise that "those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God" (Romans 8:14). And may we pass Your life onto those around us through our actions. Amen.

Today we taking in **the smell of rope** and thinking about the time that Jesus was bound (**John 18:13**) so that the soldiers could do to Jesus all that we read in the Bible passage we are concentrating on today (**Matthew 27:27-31**).

This reminds us of all that can binds us and more importantly, the love that Jesus shows in allowing himself to be bound so as to free us from all that.

In **Salt Factory** worship this evening we are taking up the same theme but putting the emphasis on receiving the freedom that Jesus offers from all that binds us.

Next week on Palm Sunday, we have a look at the last of the smells of Lent: **the smell of wood.** Remember if you have missed out on any the sermons in this series they are all available on our website in the section "For Members".

The themes over the **Easter weekend**: Maundy Thursday (led by our Salt Factory team): the smell of faith, Good Friday: the smell of love, Easter dawn service (ecumenical service at Golden Grove cemetery, combined again with Golden Grove Uniting Church): the smell life and joy; Easter main service: the smell of hope.
