As I opened the family emails, one with the above title jumped out at me: Easter's over — now what... And it got me thinking.

At church and in our homes we DO put a lot of effort into Easter celebrations – the extra church services, dramatic productions, song selections, as well as the food celebrations and over-indulgence which none of us need. But today (like many) I was back at work, as though it had just been another weekend.

But it wasn't just any weekend – we celebrated the torment Jesus endured to remove our guilt, the pain our Saviour suffered to take away our suffering, and the eternal life we receive through Christ overcoming death. And how can we respond to this? Nothing we could ever attempt to do could repay this super-human act of love – and that's just it: Jesus asks for nothing in return. Instead He brings us peace – just as He brought the message of peace to the disciples when they saw Him alive: John 20:21 Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you."

As we live in the afterglow of the Easter celebrations, may we bring Christ's peace to all we meet, sharing His love and His life.

Family Friendly Worship

At Golden Grove, we love $\underline{\textbf{everybody}}$ to be involved in worship.

This is best done by leading by example!

For our 'little ones' - Quiet bags & busy books are available for worship time from the children's area inside the church.

The "Kids at Heart" team run a QUIET craft table during the sermon. That way, the children have some time with their parents during the morning services, and also a little bit of time to be creative, to wriggle around and to learn about our God and what He means to us through artistic activities, with their friends. All children are welcome to join in this time. It is not appropriate for unattended children to play in the foyer at any time during the service. Please ask an usher if you require assistance, or speak to a "Ministry Leader" if you would like to help young families during worship times.

Pastor's Column

On this **Anzac weekend** we are actually taking in "the smell of peace." That is the theme for today's meditations, based on the Gospel reading for today (**John 20:19-31**).

Are you at peace? Jesus breathed that peace upon the disciples after his resurrection and he would do the same for us, as we live in the fragrance of Easter. This peace replaces the fear that can settle upon us, it opens us up to the gifts God would give us and it is something so personal – individually for you – for whatever you are going through.

I pray that you are open to receiving that peace from Him today.

Just to let you know what's happening with The Journey (our confirmation course). The guys on this journey of faith ("the fellow travellers") are now on holidays from our meetings. We have just completed the first leg of The Journey (on the Bible) and we are half way through the leg on Prayer. This term we plan meet on some Sundays – so parents can join us, as well as continuing to meet on Thursdays.

And what is happening with Step Up to Communion? I shall be taking all the children in years 3-5 for 3 sessions (during their "cluster devotions") this term to learn about Communion and give the years 6 and 7 a refresher on Holy Communion in one session during their cluster devotion, before holding 3 sessions on Sunday afternoons for all of those who want to take the next step (with their parents) of preparing to receive Holy Communion for the first time and then regularly after that.

If your child doesn't go to our school (or for any other reason would be missing out on the three first sessions) and would like to join the "Step Up" group see me and we shall have these 3 sessions to learn about communion on three Sundays mid-term.

And what about the theme for this coming term? This term our theme is "Walking with Jesus (through Matthew)". I have selected 9 episodes from the Gospel of Matthew to give an overview of this book of the Bible and to show what it means to walk with Jesus throughout our life. (Of course because this term also includes major Church festivals (Ascension, Pentecost and Holy Trinity) we shall also celebrate these on those particular Sundays.)

Since Jesus has risen from death he walks with us through life and since he calls us to be his disciples this entails us walking with Him and since he gives us his Holy Spirit our life will be different – holy/ growing closer to God/reliant on Jesus (We call that "sanctification"). Just what does that mean?

This is what we shall look at, starting next Sunday as we "Walk with Jesus in the desert"— into his temptation. (Matthew 4:1-11). Why not read this passage again to prepare for the meditations (on the Friday morning and Sunday morning and in the evening at Salt factory)?

I will be away at **Pastors' Conference** this week on Wednesday and Thursday at Birdwood.

Synod weekend- is NEXT WEEKEND 3rd /4th May. It is at Mawson Lakes Community Church. The theme is "*Grow and Go*". Why not visit for a few sessions? (Oh and our congregation needs another synod rep!)

And if you are not going to be at Synod, don't forget our Church's **Working Bee** next Saturday. A great opportunity, for those who can make it for fellowship with fellow worshippers.

Advance Notice: Our School and Church **Annual General Meeting** in a month's time: **Sunday 25**th **May.** Don't forget to write your reports.

As I start this year's pastor's report I ask myself: Where are we going? / Where is God leading us? / What is God telling us to take up and to leave behind? I am thinking of Matthew 16:24. Feel free to talk to me about this.


CHRISTMAS PLAY SCRIPTS

Fundraising totaling over \$4,950 was not limited to the following as others have also benefited from the day:


