Before worship

Oops... I did it again!

Have you ever broken the law? It was interesting driving with a Learner driver during their "L" plate period. There are all of these little rules that we forget. Such as: not indicating when you turn those corners near to home; not stopping at a STOP sign, or giving way at a GIVE WAY sign. They highlight it all to you.

But what about God's Laws? These ones may not be so visible – there's not a Police Officer watching out for these. But it's scary to think how many times – EVERYDAY – we break God's laws. Remember the learning of the Catechism from Confirmation lessons years ago, and Luther's explanation which helped to give context between God's Law and our daily life. Those hateful thoughts and words from a heated moment; the jealousy or envy over someone's new acquisition; giving a whole weekend to attending sports games, but then being 'too tired' to worship God for even 1 hour.

While there can be a time and place for breaking public laws – like being in labour, with the baby's birth imminent, or another serious emergency. There's never a time and place for breaking God's Laws. God's desire for us is to do good, to do his will. If we remember the first Commandment – You shall have no other Gods – then it becomes easy to keep God's law, and the more we remember it, the easier it becomes. By putting God first, we never need to fear breaking God's commands.

Pastor's Column

Welcome to our worship preceding our **Annual General Meeting** this morning.

We continue **walking with Jesus**. Now **into the grain fields** and hear him teaching, in particular about the Sabbath.

Jesus used the situation. As we'll hear (in **Matthew 12:1-14**) Jesus used an historical precedent. Later he gave another example to back up what he was teaching. And it led to him presenting the ultimate Truth which he then drove home. This was the way Jesus taught and along with the danger and drama involved, it was a *most compelling* way to teach. He teaches us this morning too.

I wonder what he has in mind for you to learn.

Some of us are not intending to go to our congregational AGM this morning (why should I?) and consequently haven't read the AGM reports in yellow book of reports, so I thought I would give you 9 reasons to go to the AGM (which will serve as a summary of the book of reports).

Why go?

- 1. To discuss how we can break out of our 'maintenance mode' at GGLF and back into mission in "knowing Christ and making him known" (as brought up in the Pastor's report- 2nd last paragraph);
- 2. To decide on building toilets and upgrading the chairs in the worship centre;
- 3. To determine what remote rural congregation with which we will have a closer relationship;
- 4. To set a theme for 'The gathering 2014' (on Sunday 24th August);
- 5. To possibly elect a new chair of the congregation. (Thanks Grant for serving for the last year.)
- 6. To take on board the 'enormous potential' of our relationship between our school and church (Principal's report- See 2nd last paragraph.);
- 7. To pray for commitment of youth leaders, meaningful conversation between youth and leaders, growth of older youth and the growth of Revival, as requested by our Youth Worker;
- 8. To have an opportunity to ask questions of the Children's Ministry Coordinator (from the Kids at Heart report) about Sunday morning ministry, being a volunteer, and Mainly Music, about the developing relationship we have with the school in Asaroka (from the Friends of Asaroka PNG report) or about our Library: its website, our gifts through the Library and our new shelving, about the GGAF fishing fete and events planned for this year or about our Men's Fellowship: working with Para Vista and TTG, providing us with a wine and cheese evening and the Longest Lutheran Lunch all from the respective coordinators' reports, or of the Treasurer from his report;
- 9. To commit ourselves to the congregation, by voting for our 2014 budget of \$240,700.




GGLF & GGLPS AGM's will be held TODAY at 11.00 am in the Worship Centre
