Greetings to any visitors here with us. We are pleased to have you join us and we trust you have felt welcomed and pray the Holy Spirit may enlighten and empower us with the

"This is My beloved Son. With Him I am well pleased. Listen to Him" - Matthew 17:5 (Voice)

message shared with us today.

God creates everything beautiful we see around us, including us. Jesus saves everyone who's willing to believe in Him. And the Holy Spirit is the ever-present guidance that we so desperately need in a confusing world. We are reminded of all three 'persons' of God in our readings for today.

"Out of nowhere, time, space, and all the living whirl forth as God speaks the universe into existence. With the utterance of His voice, creation takes form, chaos yields to order, light eclipses darkness, and emptiness fills with life" – The Voice Bible. Wow, what a description! I invite you to sit back and look at the splendour and magnificence of the nature around you today.

Studies have shown every child cries for their father's approval. During the spectacular Transfiguration, where "Jesus' face began to glow and gleam and shine like the morning sun" (Matthew 17:2, Voice), God says He's pleased with Jesus, His beloved Son. Read onto Ephesians 1:6 (Voice), which says that "ultimately God is the one worthy of praise for showing us His grace; He is merciful and marvellous, freely giving us these gifts in His Beloved. Like Jesus, and through Jesus, we are all God's beloved: unconditionally loved and wholly approved. **May you have confidence in that reminder: that God is pleased with us, even when we stuff up**.

Paul's last advice to the Corinth church came in 2 Corinthians 13:11 (Voice) – "Keep rejoicing and repair whatever is broken. Encourage each other, think as one, and live at peace; and God, the Author of love and peace, will remain with you". God remains in us through the Holy Spirit. And what wonderful advice Paul ends this letter with. Rejoice, repair, encourage, think, live, find peace. All positive words. **All totally reachable through the Holy Spirit living and remaining in us**.

Sometimes we overcomplicate our beliefs and lives. Let's make it simple today, and always.

Pastor's Column

Today we celebrate the Festival of the Holy Trinity (Trinity or Whitsunday). Keep that in mind as we confess our baptismal (Apostles') Creed and consider just who God the Father, God the Son- our Lord Jesus Christ, God the Holy Spirit is *for you*.

We are also walking up **a mountain with Jesus** on the next leg of our hike through the Gospel of Matthew. (One of our teachers informed me this week just how powerful this theme is for the children in her class. How are you finding it? Isn't it good that at both the morning service and evening services we are looking at the same theme as our school community?)

Today we'll be thinking about "the mountains" that we have to climb and remembering that Jesus climbs them with us. We'll be putting our feet into the disciples' shoes and wondering just why we are climbing this mountain. We'll see how this episode (in Matthew 17) fits in to what had just transpired (in the previous chapter) and how a mountain is a place of **being alone, praying** and **sacrifice**. So whatever mountain "you are climbing these days" remember Jesus walks with you and I am sure that that particular mountain you are climbing holds something beyond your wildest dreams on it. (Remember the disciples experiences "the Transfiguration" when they climbed the mountain with Jesus (See Matthew 17).

Next Sunday **we walk with Jesus into Jerusalem** (Matthew 21) in an atmosphere of celebration and welcome.

From our GGLF council meeting this last week:

- The Council will be conducting a short survey over these next weeks please participate.
- The date of The Gathering has be changed to Sunday 14th Sept.

As we continue preparation for The Gathering "Moving out of Maintenance Mode" last week I stated that surely our auxiliaries are prime opportunities for mission and asked the question: just how do we do that?

- Of course we personally have to have the right attitude (love for those who are not worshipping with us yet) and this attitude will then flow into the group we belong to.
- If we have as our DNA/our life blood/ our reason for being our mission statement "Knowing Christ and making him known" then surely EVERYTHING we do in that group must have that goal.
- Perhaps we have to *keep it before us* at planning meetings, at exec meetings and ... for whatever reason we meet.
- We have to be prepared to change, and change is uncomfortable. (It is more comfortable being in "maintenance mode": keep going what we have got going, doing the same old thing ... rather than change.)
- Maybe we need to do *SOMETHING RADICAL* in or to our particular group to move out of "maintenance mode".
