Before worship

'Take my yoke upon you and **learn** from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls' (Matt 11:29).

There is no better way to learn from Christ than by using the Psalms! How do we know this? Just one way is that when Jesus appeared to his disciples after his resurrection he **opened their minds** to how '... everything written about about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the **Psalms** must be fulfilled' (Luke 24:44b). Suddenly his use of Psalm 22 from the despair of the cross made sense to them - for it goes to the core of his carrying the sins of the world for our salvation.

It's no accident then that the Psalms are the most quoted Old Testament book in the New Testament - 126 times in all. In short, they show God's heart: his 'righteousness' and 'steadfast love' (Exodus 34:6-7) ... the recurring refrain of the Psalms! And profoundly, in praying the Psalms, Jesus is your personal teacher because they are his prayers. Indeed Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a famous Lutheran Pastor and Professor, executed in the dying days of WWII for standing up to the Nazis, said:

'A Psalm we cannot utter as a prayer, that makes us falter and horrifies us, is a hint to us that here Someone else is praying, not we; that One who is here protesting his innocence, who is invoking God's judgment, who has come to such indefinite depths of suffering, is none other than Jesus Christ himself. He it is who is praying here, and not only here but in the whole Psalter' (1954: 44, *Life Together*, Harper One).

And in praying with the Word (Jesus) you receive him, not least his 'rest': forgiveness! As Jesus says to us: 'For my yoke is easy and my burden is light' (Matt 11:30)

We pray: Christ, in your mercy you gave us the Psalms to pray with you as you intercede for us in every circumstance of life - happy or sad, our fault or another's. Lead us now through your Holy Spirit to receive your good things in our worship as we praise your Father to each other and the world. Amen.

Pastor's Column

Today we are starting yet another series. It is entitled **Living Psalms**. Over the next several weeks we shall be looking at particular Psalms. This week and next week, the psalm of the day and then through "third term" some of the most treasured psalms.

This morning we shall be looking at Psalms overall and how they can be used (Jesus prayer book..., allegorically..., using the feeling of the psalm...) and then looking at today's psalm, **Psalm 45**, and in particular **verse 11** *Let the king be enthralled by your beauty; honor him, for he is your lord.*

This psalm, as I said last week is a beautiful psalm – a song of praise for the king on his wedding day.

When we have a closer look at this psalm I believe this will take many of us out of comfort zone. I shall be asking, what is our "beauty"? Most significantly, what is His response to it? And thirdly, just how we are to honour him?

In **Salt Factory tonight**, I shall be taking up an aspect of this Psalm.

Next Sunday, we shall be looking at Psalm 119, in particular verse 105, *Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.*
