Psalm 23 – A Psalm of David

Psalm 23 may well be one of the most widely known Psalms. It is frequently used with funerals, even of those with a minimal relationship with God, but they know there's something – someone – bigger 'out there' who has been in control of their life.

There have been countless hymns and songs penned over the ages which capture the essence of this Psalm. That essence, which David, the shepherd boy who became King, knew very well. He experienced numerous well documented challenges throughout his life – but through it all still knew that God was in control, and that all things happened according to God's purpose (the good AND the bad!)

This Psalm is for us to pray as well – in times of trouble, times of joy, times of sadness – let this Psalm be a prayer to comfort and reassure us:

The LORD is my shepherd, I lack nothing.
He makes me lie down in green pastures,
he leads me beside quiet waters,
he refreshes my soul.
(NIV)

Quietly restoring my soul
You speak words of wisdom
Sweet words of comfort
The grace and the mercy of God.

Pastor's Column

Thank you so much **Graham** for leading our congregation in worship this morning and presenting the message in both the morning and evening services.

What a wonderful Psalm – **Psalm 23** in our series on “*Living Psalms*” that Graham will be preaching on:

¹The LORD is my shepherd, I lack nothing.
² He makes me lie down in green pastures,
he leads me beside quiet waters,
³ he refreshes my soul.
He guides me along the right paths
for his name's sake.
⁴Even though I walk
through the darkest valley,
I will fear no evil,
for you are with me;
your rod and your staff,
they comfort me.
⁵You prepare a table before me
in the presence of my enemies.
You anoint my head with oil;
my cup overflows.
⁶Surely your goodness and love will follow me
all the days of my life,
and I will dwell in the house of the LORD
forever.

I have preached on this psalm a number of times at Sunday worship (It is the designated psalm in the traditional lectionary for the 4th Sunday of Easter, “Good Shepherd Sunday”), at funerals and weddings, as well as using it for devotions at hospital beds and very often at death beds. It is such a comforting passage of Scripture. But it is also encouraging and an inspiring one as well and once we understand the setting of shepherd and the sheep in Biblical times, as no doubt we will be led to this morning, we'll see how relevant it is for every day of our life.

As I asked last week: *Are you interested in Bible Study?* I am prepared to run weekly Bible Studies (Wednesday evenings starting when I get back from annual leave) if there is any interest. The format would depend on what the group would like, eg. lectionary, topical, a particular book of the Bible...**(Let me know if you are interested, through the Welcome Sheets or email me - I don't want to be sitting alone in the Fellowship centre!)**

It struck me at Salt Factory camp fire service a couple of weeks ago when we were looking at *Your Word is a lamp to my feet...* (**Psalm 119**) that it seemed many people present didn't read their Bibles regularly and yet couldn't answer why not. I thought maybe a Bible Study would help.

We are taking 2 weeks of my **annual leave**. These days we are in Brisbane visiting our daughter Lisa and Eduardo and their four sons, Antonio, Patrick, Sebastian and Oliver. I plan to be back in the office, Monday week.

Even though I stated that after these holidays I would be taking Monday morning off (in lieu of Friday morning - *which I am now available*) I have been advised by a few people not to take this half day off. (A fellow pastor actually begged me on bended knee - quite dramatic, not to do so for my health's sake.) So we'll see what pans out.
