Before worship

Psalm 150:6 (MSG) – “Let every living, breathing creature praise God! Hallelujah!”

All throughout the Psalms (and Bible, too) we are reminded of all the reasons we have to praise God. From God’s creative brilliance to Jesus’ monumental sacrifice, or the sheer love of God to the protection of the Holy Spirit. Even the undeserved grace that we receive and the freedom that comes with God’s forgiveness. There are so many reasons that we have to praise God.

I’ve always seen praising God as a celebration: full of life and energy. Now I’ve had some pretty rad birthday parties over the years (from HJs on the playground, to bowling, then sophisticated dinners where I spill food all over myself), and I reckon God wants us to party when He asks us to praise Him.

We find in all our readings today that people praise God for the life He has given us. The Israelites were grumbling and moaning as they wandered through the desert hungry. So the Lord satisfied their needs and gave them a reason to praise. As God promises to Moses in Exodus 16:12 (NLT): “In the evening you will have meat to eat, and in the morning you will have all the bread you want. Then you will know that I am the Lord”. In Philippians 1, Paul writes that he is torn between the benefit of death and life, believing that “living means living for Christ, and dying is even better. But if I live, I can do more fruitful work for Christ”. We can praise God with our lives, “conducting ourselves in a manner worthy of the Good News about Christ” (Philippians 1:27).

Finally, in the Parable of Vineyard Workers, we see the opposite of praise: ungratefulness. Even though all the workers agreed on the wages they were eventually paid, they were unhappy when they compared their pay to others who did ‘less’ work. This parable refers to the kingdom of God, and how it doesn’t matter how long we believe in God, rather if we believe and if we give Him praise.

We are created to show God our thanks and appreciation for the gift of life we have. That’s pretty special if you ask me.

Pastor's Column

What do you think of praising God?

Is it something you just don't get around to? Do you find praising God boring? Are you unsure what I am talking about in regard to praising God?

When we read the psalm for this week- **Psalm 150**, the culmination of the Book of Psalms and our series "*Living Psalms*", we might get the impression that the writer is grasping at means to express his praise. He has so much praise for God that he has to call on all that he can to express it. He knows that the Lord is worthy of praise - so worthy in fact that he will go to whatever extremes he can, to offer his praise.

This morning I am going to have a closer look at this psalm with you by considering the **where, why and how of praise**.

I have entitled this "**the power of praise**". But in fact the power is not in the praise. It comes from our faith in God and that we are in fact created to praise God and so praise is good for us.

This morning **Anthony Mertin** and **Dale Bruce** will be receiving his first communion/ being admitted to the Sacrament of the Altar. Welcome Anthony and Dale into communion membership of our congregation and welcome to all your family and those friends who have come to celebrate this important event in your life.

Also this morning we'll be giving our farewell (prayer and blessing) to **Matt Bishop** who has been doing his ALC field -work with us over the last 3-4 years. Matt will starting is vicarage in the next few months. This is not our actual good-bye. He will be preaching for us on the 5th October while I am on annual leave.

The youth are putting on a **special morning tea** after worship this morning as an their expression of service. As part of their Friday night activity they baked and we shall enjoy their efforts this morning.

This evening I shall be taking this up at the "*Hill Connect*" youth service at Strathalbyn.

Salt Factory this evening is a praise night where you are asked to bring along "your expression of praise": either a song, reading.....
