Before worship

What you believe is more important than what you do

The religious people of Jesus time liked to sit around talking about what they should do. It sounds a lot like people these days. And these discussions would lead to quite strong arguments. We can relate to that too these days, can't we? The difference perhaps is that in Jesus' day they always brought God into the discussion.

That is the background to the question the religious people asked Jesus, which we read about in the Gospel reading this morning (Matthew 22:34-46) "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" We also read that that they did this to test Jesusmeaning to trap him.

Jesus had an answer- one they should really have known- if they knew their Scriptures. Love God, love your neighbour. But what made this revolutionary was Jesus saying that love actually sums up all the commandments. In other words, if you love- you keep all the commandments. Those religious leaders should have felt condemned by this because much of what they were doing was not done in love and in particular this testing Jesus.

But Jesus doesn't leave them there. He asks them a question- a riddle from the Scriptures. If the Messiah is the son of David how can he also be his Lord? The answer can only be found in knowing who Jesus is, in other words by believing in Jesus. This is more important than what a person does. It gives the motivation for what one does. Believing in Jesus is knowing what He has done (and is doing for us) and so loving Him in response, which shows itself in what we do. So, what you believe is more important than what you do!

The confirmees this morning and evening are giving an expression of what they believe in their "I believe statements". You might hear in these statements that they haven't always done the right thing, haven't always loved, haven't always believed strongly. But they are still holding onto Jesus- believing in Him and He is still there.

Believing is a gift from God, the Holy Spirit. As part of the service today they will receive the blessing which is an expression of the Spirit at work, strengthening and renewing their faith.

Prayer: Lord, fill us with your Holy Spirit so that we may love you and show that love in what we do. Forgive us when we haven't loved and allow our gratitude for your forgiveness to show itself in what we do in love. Father, continue to show us how to love you and the people you put before us- "our neighbours". All this we pray in Jesus' name through the power of your Holy Spirit. Amen.

Pastor's Column

Welcome to all those who have come for the Confirmation Services today.

Nine young people went on "The Journey (of faith)" with me this year: **Tai Appelt, Melissa Balnaves, Dale Bruce, Leo Gal, Clinton Nitschke, Isaac Norrey, Gianni Romano, Hannah Seeliger, Nicholas Schmocker** and four of them will be confirmed this morning, one tonight, one next Sunday morning, one next Sunday evening, one in a month's time, and another one, God willing, later in the year.

Because of **Reformation Day** this week, we are holding our **Longest Lutheran Lunch** today. I hope you are planning to join us. The Korean Church Community is providing the soup.

The **Korean Church Community** are also blessing us in our worship with a song.

A very warm welcome also to **Ms Amber Lownds and her 1/2 class from our school** along with all their families and friends. The 1/2 class will be presenting encouragement to care.

This is the essence of the theme for today Letter from God: encouragement by being cared for in 1 Thessalonians 2:1-8, especially the last 2 verses ... Instead, we were like young children among you. Just as a nursing mother cares for her children, so we cared for you. Because we loved you so much, we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well.

I love that image of the nursing mother who knows the need, who would do anything for her child, yes, even what is most unexpected. I know that this is beyond even the most caring mothers and what strikes me, because this is Pastor (and Apostle) Paul speaking, it shows up my lack of caring as a pastor. However, I do know someone who cares for us in this way. I will tell you about it in the address this morning.

Next Sunday the theme is *Encouragement through God's Word* based on 1 Thessalonians 2:9-13.

There are a lot of exciting events in our congregation coming up:-

- more confirmations, as I alluded to above;
- a few **baptisms** at the end of the month, (Pastor Len officiating at these);
- Pastor Lyle Bartel leading our service (while I am leading Callington's 150th anniversary)- 23rd November;
- our **church/school picnic** beginning with an outdoor worship service on the first Sunday in December (7/12/14). In regard to this this remember we have a later service that Sunday (10.30am to accommodate for the picnic;
- Carols by Candlelight on our church/school grounds on 14th December;
- **Our Christmas Play** on the 21st December (instead of the Salt Factory service) and Christmas Eve.

FYI our partnership with the Central Eyre Peninsula Parish is going ahead. We are lending books from our church library. The congregations have my contact numbers in case anyone needs to be billeted in Adelaide and Pastor Stephen and myself will have an exchange of pulpits after Easter in 2015.

"THE JOURNEY" (OF

FAITH) was a 40 session course that 9 young people took this year over the last 8 months. It was designed to

give these people the tools to grow – and continue to grow – in their faith: the Bible, prayer, the community of believers (the catechism was the tool here) and in how to respond to the world (the Commandments, through witnessing and serving).

The sessions were held on Thursday afternoons after school, and Sunday afternoons with parents, along with a day camp, a half day camp, excursions (to different churches and the cemetery) as well as interacting with guest speakers.

The travellers on The Journey were (and are) expected to worship, read the Bible, pray and journal regularly. As you can tell The Journey is an ongoing experience and even though some of these young people will be confirmed (strengthened) in their faith today I pray and expect them to keep on growing as they continue their own journey of faith.

know that we have what we asked for." 1 John 5: 14-15"


Meet at 5.30 pm TONIGHT for "Reaching out through prayer"
