## Before Worship...

Today's Gospel reading describes a wedding at Cana where Jesus turns water into wine. Traditionally the bridegroom supplied the wine for a wedding, publically declaring his suitability as a husband. To run out of wine would have shed doubt on his happiness at the marriage and his ability to provide for his new wife. So here, at this wedding, the bridegroom's whole status within the community was about to be demolished.

Then Jesus stepped in. He didn't just provide what was needed though, He was lavish! Six large stone jars. If all the water was turned into wine then He supplied between 500 and 800 litres of the stuff! A bridegroom par excellence! Not just the people of the wedding party, the guests or even of the town, but also those of all the surrounding districts could have got drunk on that amount. Imagine a bridegroom's reputation if the wine flowed that freely! 'Here's a happy man who knows how to provide for his family!'

So Jesus didn't just rescue the bridegroom, He blessed him beyond measure - but He also revealed Himself as the true 'Bridegroom', rejoicing with and over His bride (His people) and supplying all they could need and more. The beginning of the fulfilment of Isaiah's prophecy that;

"As a bridegroom rejoices over his bride so will God rejoice over you."

Is 62 v 5

*Prayer:* Dear Lord, there is so much to wonder about in the little anecdotal episode of Jesus turning water into wine. It gives us comfort to know You care about individuals, You bless the events of our lives and provide abundant provision, but best is the wonder that You rejoice over us. May we find security in this and relax and enjoy Your loving presence every day. In Jesus Name, Amen.

Wow, if only our church was like the church was in Corinth in Paul's day. (You'll hear it in the second reading for today: 1 Corinthians 12:1-11). I reckon it was very much like what happened to the Samaritans which we heard about last week when Paul and John placed their hands on them. (Acts 8:17)

But Paul was saying all this to set them right. They had been misusing those gifts.
