Before Worship

If someone claims, "I love God," but hates his brother or sister, then he is a liar. Anyone who does not love a brother or sister, whom he has seen, cannot possibly love God, whom he has never seen. He gave us a clear command, that all who love God must also love their brothers and sisters (1 John 4:20-21, Voice).

Do you believe that there's a choice when it comes to love? How do you choose to respond to love: both given by you and received by you? What about when you choose to direct hate towards someone else or when hate is directed at you? I think that the choices we make define us so vividly. We think of love, at times, as a choice. And sure, it's easy to love those people in our lives that love us back. Those people who we would be willing to sacrifice everything for. But what about the other 7 billion people in the world? How should we love them?

God wants us to respond to all circumstances with love. Love and acceptance is something that is missing in today's society, but is at the core of God's message and Jesus' mission. In the Golden Calf episode (Exodus 32), God responds to 'stiff-necked' people with love. When we worry, God calls us to seek first His righteousness and allow His love to conquer (Matthew 6:33). Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them (1 John 4:16b). May God's love be the example in our love. Forever and always. We love, because He first loved us (1 John 4:19).

Prayer: Dad, please help Your love become the core of our being on this Earth. May we serve Your people with respect, acceptance, joy and sacrifice, just as You did as You loved us first. Thanks for that. Amen.

Welcome to our worship. We are starting a new theme in worship this week: The Gift of the Ten Commandments. Have you ever thought of the Ten Commandments as a gift? Most often we think of them as a set of rules that spoil our fun and make us feel guilty.

If we are to look at them as a gift, what gift does the first commandment present? We'll discover that this morning. But I will say now that I reckon it has to with love, in that God gives himself to us. You'll hear that in the readings and the songs this morning.

Today we are celebrating the life of "Mainly Music" in our congregation. Mainly Music is a program for parents with toddlers built around hospitality, action songs and support. Through James Ziersch (our school chaplain) we used this program over the last 2 years. Thanks to James, the leaders, the members of our congregation who served and those many families who attended. Mainly Music is now in recess but we plan to start it again when we have a new coordinator and leader.

Next week we'll consider the second commandment and the best use of God's name. It's also Mothers' Day and we'll be praying for mothers, using the imagery of a mother and blessing our mothers in song.

Coming up in the next few weeks are a couple of conferences that you might be interested in. 

Asaroka Teachers Visit

The recent visit by Peter Hasu and 6 of his teachers from Asaroka was a great success all round. They were able to spend some time with our school and visit others, and meet the congregation. They were also able to visit and personally thank several organisations that provided goods that we have sent to them over the last few years.

A special event was held while they were here, which meant a lot more to them than we realise. We planted 2 new trees in a Partnership Ceremony with them, which are located in the garden bed where the old sign was near the carpark exit. This reciprocated what happened at Asaroka in 2011 during the visit there, and really in their eyes cemented our Partnership with them. Also in a combined project between GGLF and GGLPS, a 20ft container has been purchased which is now by the shed. Already inside it is 6 pallets of books that were picked out personally by the Asaroka teachers for their departments while they were here to the delight of the people at the book depot, which have assisted us before. This container will be filled over time with targeted goods that their school badly needs before being sent. More on that to follow.

Thanks heaps to everyone who contributed in any way during their visit. Apparently most of the Asaroka School was there to excitedly greet them in Goroka on their return. The Blessings of this partnership are immeasurable to the whole community at Asaroka, God is definitely blessing all concerned, including us here.
