Getting There: Self Drive (approx. 688 km), **or Bus Travel** – The time of bus departure will be 9.00 am on Friday **7 Jun 2013** for arrival at Elliston at about 6.00 pm. Pick up/drop off will be at the Golden Grove Lutheran Church car park at Wynn Vale. Check out of the cabins at Elliston will be 10am on the Monday but we anticipate that the bus will leave at 9.00 am. Arrival back in Adelaide will be at about 6.00 pm including a stop for lunch along the way.

Other costs: The evening meals on Friday and Sunday night will be catered for at a cost of approx. \$20/head for 2 meals. It is envisaged that we will go to the Elliston hotel (walking distance) for a meal on the Saturday night. You will need to bring your own food for lunch and breakfast. There is a supermarket and bakery in the Elliston township (walking distance)

If you wish to book a seat on the bus a deposit of \$50 will be required.
