## Pastor's Column

This morning we are focusing on the fifth commandment. It's more than committing murder. It has as a basis that **life is a gift from God**. In the address this morning we'll have a quick look at the consequence of this truth this morning; we'll consider the depth that Jesus gives this truth and then the encouragement to live this truth.

We are also installing Christiaan as **hospital chaplain** for the RAH and Lyell McEwen Hospital.

This evening the **Salt Factory** worship I will be speaking on Jesus' parables and in particular one parable that is often over-looked yet has a very important message for us.

Next Sunday we are launching the **Bible for the persecuted**; a 21 day program, which partners us with Bible League to make a difference in the lives of persecuted Christians. "Being involved in this program will enable you to personally provide encouragement and strengthen to persecuted believers, through the Bibles provided.... Your gifts and prayers will really make a difference."

What's more, those who are suffering for their faith in Jesus Christ don't ask for the persecution to stop, they simply plead: "*Pray for us and please send Bibles.*"

Next week we are being provided with a "passport with no boundaries" prayer resource booklet and a Bible shaped money box (similar to the ones we have used for the last 2 years). Don't miss out.

Didn't **last Sunday's AGMs** have a wonderful atmosphere? The highlights for me was Daryl's presentation of what is happening in our school- especially in regard to 2016; the positive reports, the election of a chairman for our Fellowship's Council (note the new name) and the passing of the youth initiative of a larger multipurpose area (encompassing the Fellowship Lounge and the Pastor's Church study- yet still enabling these rooms to be used separately).

I am looking forward to the next "Gathering" and a fun/fund event which were both mooted at the Fellowship's AGM.

I understand there will be an extra special meeting after worship in the near future to finalize a couple of items that still need to be dealt with.
