

### Before Worship ....

"'Well done, my good servant!' his master replied. 'Because you have been trustworthy in a very small matter, take charge of ten cities.' (Luke 19: 17)

Have you ever thought of your possessions as the things with which you have been entrusted?

If you could see them this way, then the Parable of the Minas (Luke 19- the Gospel reading chosen for today) would be telling us that one day God will hold us to account.

Then what will God says to you when he comes back on Judgment Day?

Doesn't it depend on what He has in mind in what we do with our possessions? But in the story Jesus told the master never told the servants what to do with their mina. He simply told them to: 'Put this money to work.' They had to know the master to know what he meant by this. They had to know the Master himself.

We use our possessions to look after ourselves and our family, to enjoy life as well as being generous.

We gather that from how well we know God.

May you get to know God better this morning in our worship so that you use your possessions well and in passing this "test" (as the servant who was addressed in the verse above) be blessed with much more entrusted to us in the life ahead.

**Prayer:** Thank you for all that you have entrusted to us in this life, Heavenly Father. Thank you Lord Jesus for forgiving us for selfishness, distrust in your generosity and waste. Dear Holy Spirit may we get to know the Heavenly Father and our Lord Jesus well so that we may use our possessions in a manner that will please you. Amen.

### Pastor's Column

### Do you ever feel guilty in having so much?

But we really don't have that much, do we? SLIDE Compared to the rich- well ..... compared to most of society, we don't have that much. Yet *compared* with the majority of the world we are very, very rich.

But should we feel guilty?

What is the seventh commandment? It's: You shall not steal and putting that into the positive, it has as its foundation **God's gift of our possessions**. So to honour God, to give respect to this gift and to get the most out of life God has given us three ways to treat our possessions. **Enjoy** them and respond with thanks. God has given us *more than enough* so that we can be **generous**. And God has given us what we have so that we can show that we are trustworthy and learn to be **good stewards**. That's what we shall be looking at in this morning's address.

Have you thought of being a mentor? Wynn Vale School is keen to start MENTORING PROGRAM which they are going to call "LAP program"

They are looking for people who: can provide special individual time and care for ONE student; is available for ONE hour a week; will develop a positive relationship with a student to increase their self esteem and confidence; communicate a sense of value, friendship and personal worth to make a child feel special and would like to pass on a skill to the next generation ie: woodwork, cooking, making a model, painting or anything!!

Our CPSW (chaplain) at Wynn Vale School Cynthia Harbinson is going to speak on this opportunity this morning during our worship. I hope you pray about whether God wants you to step out to do this.

In this week's enews you would have received an invitation to fill in the "Finance Questions" through "Survey Monkey", which our District Bishop would like us to answer. Please note that the guest speaker at Salt Factory **TONIGHT** is **Bishop Michael Musale of Kenya who will be encouraging us to rediscover the forgotten vision for nation-building.** 

Allow me to share a little about Bishop Michael (from David D'Lima)

Bishop Michael well understands the role of Western nations as vessels in the hand of Almighty God and at a very personal level he is a beneficiary of the highest quality education that was provided by British ambitions to enrich Kenya (at the Prince of Wales school in Nairobi). Michael was among the first black students to gain such a prestigious education in Kenya.

Bishop Michael is keen to encourage churches that will benefit from being refreshed and renewed in the biblical theology of nation-building. His own aims for Kenya include a stimulating ambition for nation-building, which he will also explain as he speaks to groups here in South Australia.

"I'm a bishop overseeing churches in Kenya, mentoring pastors and developing leaders," he told Jayne Lochert during a Life FM interview when he visited Adelaide last year.

"I have been working with communities that are vulnerable, desperate, hurting and sick. I've had a compassion for them. I went through a process that has helped me a great deal, that is helping my children, and I would wish that others also have an opportunity to go through a similar process ... to take little children who are vulnerable, desperate, sick and dying, and develop them into future leaders who will steer our country of Kenya to great prosperity and national cohesion."

A conservative evangelical, Bishop Michael is pleased to encourage God's people in our nation-building vocation. As part of his ministry he will be pleased to explain his work in Kenya, and to invite people to connect with his ministry as prayer partners.

We are continuing "Bibles for the persecuted": the 21 day program, which partners us with Bible League to make a difference in the lives of persecuted Christians. "Being involved in this program will enable you to personally provide encouragement and strengthen to persecuted believers, through the Bibles provided.... Your gifts and prayers will really make a difference."

What's more, those who are suffering for their faith in Jesus Christ don't ask for the persecution to stop, they simply plead: "Pray for us and please send Bibles."

Please pick up your "passport with no boundaries" prayer resource booklet and a Bible shaped money box today to ensure that you don't miss out.
