WELCOME to all worshipping with us today

Greetings to any visitors here with us. We are pleased to have you join us and we trust you have felt welcomed and pray the Holy Spirit may enlighten and empower us with the messages shared today.

Before Worship

The first reading for today (1 Kings 21:1-16) gives a vivid presentation of the ninth and tenth commandments (summed by the simple command: You shall not covet) in the form of a story.

- Ask yourself, what went wrong? (It's quite alright to want something, but....) Have a look at Verse 4: **So Ahab went home, sullen and angry because Naboth the Jezreelite had said, "I will not give you the inheritance of my ancestors." He lay on his bed sulking and refused to eat.**
- Ponder, how did it go wrong? It has something to do with the heart. Listen to the clue Jesus gives in the Gospel reading for this morning (in particular verses 17-20 of Matthew 15).
- Then consider, what other commandments were broken from this coveting. (Verse 7-15): **"Jezebel his wife said, "Is this how you act as king over Israel? Get up and eat! Cheer up. I'll get you the vineyard of Naboth the Jezreelite." So she wrote letters in Ahab's name, placed his seal on them, and sent them to the elders and nobles who lived in Naboth's city with him. In those letters she wrote: "Proclaim a day of fasting and seat Naboth in a prominent place among the people. But seat two scoundrels opposite him and have them bring charges that he has cursed both God and the king. Then take him out and stone him to death." So the elders and nobles who lived in Naboth's city did as Jezebel directed in the letters she had written to them. They proclaimed a fast and seated Naboth in a prominent place among the people. Then two scoundrels came and sat opposite him and brought charges against Naboth before the people, saying, "Naboth has cursed both God and the king." So they took him outside the city and stoned him to death. Then they sent word to Jezebel: "Naboth has been stoned to death." As soon as Jezebel heard that Naboth had been stoned to death, she said to Ahab, "Get up and take possession of the vineyard of Naboth the Jezreelite that he refused to sell you. He is no longer alive, but dead." I can pick at least 5 commandments broken here. (I will tell you what they are in the sermon this morning.)**
- Then reflect on your our heart: have you let things get to you, allowed them to become too important/ an addiction/ a compulsion/ a driving force, which can lead to other sins being committed? Commend it to God.

*Father, forgive me for breaking these concluding commandments, through Jesus' death for me. Fill me with your Holy Spirit that I may be at peace and have a contented heart. Open me up to what you have to say to me today that I may grow to love you and to trust you more.
Amen.*

Pastor's Column

Are you content with what you have? Can you say the 23rd Psalm ("The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want") with conviction? Have you received God's gift of a holy heart? They are the questions that the ninth and tenth commandments (summed up by "You shall not covet.") put to us?

This morning we conclude our sermon series on "The Gift of the Commandments" by looking at these two: we'll consider why God gave these commandments, how we break them and then what is the antidote to the disease of coveting (greed, jealous, the internal struggle) – in other words just how God gives us this "gift of a holy heart".

Welcome to Angela and Mark Hancock and all who have come to celebrate **Sebastian's baptism**.

Welcome too to the **families of the R/1 class** who will be performing a skit and giving us a powerpoint presentation.

Salt Factory tonight is a Camp Fire Service with Holy Communion. Ivan Schmocker will be speaking "Parables that grow on you".

(*Of course you can continue personally using the program – there are still devotion books and money boxes in the foyer.*)

This Thursday I'll be attending a workshop "**Teaching Christian Meditation to students**", with our chaplain James Ziersch. I shall be discerning if and how we could implement Christian Meditation into our school. Please pray for this ministry and feel free to talk to me about this if you would like to know more.

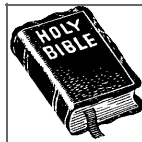
