#### Before Worship ....

As a child and even with our own children it was fun to play the game 'Find the Thimble.' Someone would hide the thimble somewhere in the house and then the rest would take turns trying to find it. There was always encouragement from the one who had hidden it using temperature as a measure of how close you were to finding it — "Cold ... colder, warm, getting warmer, hot, HOT!" It was always somewhere unexpected and there were often words of despair when it took too long to find but then whoops of joy when it was discovered. This little game came to mind when I read Amos's words about the 'famine of God's word'.

Surely today people are searching for enlightenment in a plethora of places. There is no shortage of ideas or directions claiming to know the source of hope. Whether it be from the commercial sector with its bigger - better - newer slogans, the television and movie sources with their constant display of the supernatural, the horoscopes and spiritualists, cultural and mystic claims, even from better health through meditation, exercise and food supplements, or even education - each one seems to claim they can solve the mysteries for us.

But none of these leads us to find the word of God. All are fruitless ways. Why? Because the word is hidden – hidden in the **Word of God** – His Son Jesus, who became flesh and lived among us, "Full of grace and truth" as The Gospel of John proclaims. The only time we can get warm to God is when He comes to us in Jesus Christ. When He reveals the Gospel to us and we taste and see His mercy and forgiveness. Then the search is ended and we can whoop with joy and proclaim, "Found it" – the Word of the Lord that is!

Praise and thanks to You dear Lord for You came to us. The furthest we have to search is inside the cover of a Bible and there You are — not famine but feast, in Jesus Christ. Amen.

## Pastor's Column

"Who is Christ?" We are continuing our study of the book of Colossians by again looking at the second reading set down for the day (Colossians 1:15-28). Paul in this text gives us some depth into who Christ actually is. He calls it "The mystery of Christ" which is our theme for this morning's address.

In the address I would like to consider this mystery with you as *Christ within you*. There are at least three aspects of that mystery that strike me here: Christ is the Creator, Christ is the Head of the Church, and Christ, our Peace-maker. I believe when we take this to heart, everything we are and do changes.

At **Salt Factory** this evening we shall be continuing the theme of forgiveness. Todd Heynen will be presenting what God has given to him about forgiveness. (Remember I receive and approve all messages written by non-pastors.) What a wonderful testimony Jason gave last week on forgiveness- God is certainly at work here.

**Next Sunday**, we begin "Our walk through Genesis", fitting in the theme of our School during the week with "The fall into sin". (Note that we look at God creating tomorrow in the opening of third term.) What a tragic way to start our walk- with a fall. But until we realize our fallen state we will never appreciate what Christ has done for us to lift us up through his forgiveness.

"The Gathering: Saturday, 31/8/13. The theme: What is the next step on our journey to care/communicate/connect"? 8.30am-1pm at "Wirrimbirra" Ivan and Elnora Schmockers', Lot 65 - block at the end of Grenfell Road. As with previous Gatherings (this is the 6<sup>th</sup> one): corporate worship, presentation, morning tea (bring a plate to share), quiet time in a tranquil setting, group feedback of what God is saying to us, culminating in Holy Communion and BBQ lunch (donation). Come along.

Please note the invitation that Lee Norrey has given to join other women for **Bible Study either Friday or Monday afternoon**. I fully endorse this and in fact I am so pleased that Lee is leading these that I plan to attend the first few.

**Again I would like to ask: How's your Bible reading going?** And to invite you to use the "**Daily Bible Readings**" as your guide. Remember we print them on the back page of the Bulletin each week. I would love the congregation to see this as a major way in which we are united, ie. Every one reading the same Bible passages each day, as people meet having a common passage to discuss and every team meeting beginning with a devotion based on the text of the day.

I hope you picked up the latest **GGLF Community Directory** last week. If for some reason you missed out please see Judith or myself.


