Pastor's Column

The story of Noah raises many questions- questions that have worried people through the ages. In fact, some people claim they can't believe in God until they get answers to these questions.

Isn't it good as we walk with God through the book of Genesis, that we can pose such question to God?

Yet I recon the foremost question to which we need to an answer is why Noah?

God saw something in Noah. He was like a light shining in a dark world. He found favour with God and walked faithfully with God. (Genesis 6:9)

But this is a reflection on God. God had given Noah these qualities. He had drawn them out of Noah and he would save Noah and his family - to create a whole new world, through them.

This shows the nature of God. And it's this that we shall be looking at in the sermon this morning. We'll see God is for the individual. He uses his own means. And He is by nature, a savior God.

The God who saved Noah is the same God who is alive today so this morning we are going to consider these aspects of his character to help us to: "Walk faithfully with God".

Next Sunday we take up the theme of **"Walking humbly with God"** in the sermon. It is based on God confusing the languages in Genesis 11.

2013 FRITZSCHE ORATION

Rev Dr Mark Worthing will deliver the address for the 2013 Fritzsche Oration at Australian Lutheran College (ALC) on Monday, 12 August at 7.30pm. The title for his presentation is 'Theological adventurism among early Australian Lutherans: the strange case of Pastor August Kavel's protestations against the Lutheran Confessions'. The Fritzsche Oration is an initiative of Lutheran Archives and the Australian Lutheran Institute for Theology and Ethics (ALITE), part of Australian Lutheran College (ALC). The oration highlights the contribution of theologians of the Church to the history of Australian Lutheranism. In the early 1840s Gotthard Fritzsche opened a small college in Lobethal SA to provide theological education for pastors and teachers, inspiring generations of theological training in Australia.

The James & Diana Ramsay Foundation Scholarship

Concordia College has approached Lutheran Community Care to help identify potential worthy recipients to apply for this scholarship.

This scholarship is funded by The James and Diana Ramsay Foundation and is a full scholarship for a Year 8 student to commence in 2014. The scholarship will be awarded to a day student and has been designed specifically for low income families who aspire to provide an excellent education for their child but are not in a position to fund an independent education due to disadvantage. Disadvantage may be determined by economic or social hardship or both. Preference will be given to School Card Holders.

Applicants must be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia, within the meaning of the Australian Citizenship Act 2006.

Applications close on Friday 16 August 2013 and the recipient will be notified by Friday 6 September 2013.
