Before Worship

Joseph's brothers saw a problem coming – their dreamer brother, their Father's favourite - and they wanted to get rid of him. What shrewdness they showed in understanding the problem of guilt – the "blood on their hands," if they killed him. They sent him off as a slave instead. It must have given them some sort of smug satisfaction that they were getting rid of their problem and preventing Joseph's dreams of eventuating as well. Little did they know!! Their shrewdness to solve their immediate problem became God's provision for the future of all Israel.

In the Gospel reading Jesus praised the unfaithful servant for his insight and cunning in using his master's money to curry favour with people and pave the way for his own future. Jesus' comment about the 'people of light' and their need to be just as shrewd can seem a bit difficult to understand.

Perhaps Jesus is emphasizing that we have the opportunity to use our Father's provisions to curry the favour of others too, not for our benefit but so they will see that we do not love money and possessions but instead we love God and we care about them in line with God's love for them. Paul says to Timothy, "God wants all people to come to the knowledge of the truth and be saved in Jesus Christ". Just as praying for the authorities and good government paves the way for the Gospel to be freely shared in peace, so sharing what we have been blessed with can pave the way for the Holy Spirit to work faith in the lives of those whom God already loves. Our shrewdness can become God's provision for the salvation of many others.

Lord we often understand shrewdness in terms of trickery and so may not see it as legitimate in terms of sharing the Gospel. Help us to be insightful, perceptive and discerning in using all you have given us in the service of others. Thank You that You use even our immature and sinful motives and redeem them to fulfil Your purposes as well. In Jesus Name, Amen.
