### Before Worship ....

**If we died with Him, we will live with Him. If we remain with Him, we will reign alongside Him...If we are unfaithful, He remains faithful, for He is not able to deny Himself (2 Timothy 2:11-13, Voice).**

We live a life of experiences, don't we? From stunning highs to crashing lows, we can have a brilliant day today, and a terrible day tomorrow. Or, worse still, a fantastic morning and a preposterous afternoon. People were exiled from Jerusalem to Babylon in order to find peace amongst themselves and in the city (Jeremiah 29:4-7). Paul was bound and chained like a lawbreaker for proclaiming God's good news (2 Timothy 2:8-15). Ten lepers were instantly healed of a heart-breaking illness, with only one of them returning thanks (Luke 17:11-19). All sad stories to begin with. But what does God do with each of them? He makes them good. He does this incredible fixing job, working through each situation in exactly the way He knows how. Exactly the way that He wants to.

Are we truly thankful? When do we praise God for the wonderful, world-changing gift of Jesus? And when do we praise God for the more turbulent times in our lives: when we suffer and learn? After all, we endure hardships "so that we might experience salvation with lasting, eternal glory through Jesus, our Liberating King" (2 Timothy 2:10). Thankfulness is the key to our relationship with Christ. "When you rise in the morning, give thanks for the light, for your life, for your strength. Give thanks for your food and for the joy of living. If you see no reason to give thanks, the fault lies in yourself".

Paul also seriously challenges Timothy here. Do you do everything that you can to present yourself to God as a person who is fully genuine? Are you a worker for Christ unashamed of your mission? Can you guide others, leading them to the correct path defined by the word of truth? (2 Timothy 2:15). May you be challenged by these words the same way Timothy was.

**Prayer:** *Dad, help us to be unashamed of who you are and who we are in You. Please give us the courage to work at it with a genuine heart, guiding others to Your simple truth. And help us to be thankful for everything that we see around us. After all, it's all Yours. Did I mention that I'm heaps thankful that You made us and the world? Good. Amen.*

In my message this morning based on the Gospel reading for today (Luke 17:11-19) - "A heart of a son or daughter OR a servant", we'll be considering a few questions about giving. The one man who had been suffering from leprosy and returned to Jesus praising God and thanking him raises the question in Jesus' mind about the other nine who were healed. What heart did they have? This man gave thanks while the others only gave obedience; he gave to Jesus while the others gave in a formalized way; he couldn't help but give while they only gave because they were told to. It highlights the difference between the heart of a son and daughter and the heart of a servant and it asks us what heart do we have?

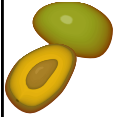
