Before Worship

What makes a saint? We might get a variety of answers to this question. Death makes a saint. You hear about what a saint the deceased is in their eulogy.

I suggest, in the address this morning, that the situation a person is placed as they struggle with it, can make (or break) a saint. But really it's a wrong question. The question should be, Who makes a saint?

Of course the answer to that is God. He gives us the gifts which are a good example for others to follow and that is what makes a

When we are open to what God is doing in our life then he can make us a saint too.

In the Gospel reading for this morning, Luke 18:9-14 Jesus' story of the Pharisee and the tax collector,

9 To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everyone else, Jesus told this parable: 10 "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. 11 The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people--robbers, evildoers, adulterers--or even like this tax collector. 12 I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get. 13 "But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.' 14 "I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

Who is the saint?

Surely it is the tax collector. He knew himself, he knew his sin, knew his need for God.

God had worked Godly sorrow in his life and this led to his repentance. God gave him the gift of humility.

And doesn't this encourage us to do likewise and so "be justified before God"?

As I say in the address this morning (on our Reformation Day) this is the person I am sure Martin Luther would be able to relate to. The tax collector was the saint. He shows us an aspect of how we should live our life but it all comes back to God.

Thank God for what God does in and through the saints.

Father, thank you for this tax collector- a saint. May his life this example encourage us to deal with our sin well- in that we recognize it, allow you to give us his sorrow over it, repent of it and allow you to take it away, so that we are justified before you. Use our worship this **Pastor Leon** morning to do just this Amen.

Pastor's Column

We have chosen today to celebrate **Thanksgiving Sunday** as we commemorate **Reformation Day.** We have much to be thankful for: life, family and friends... our church facilities. But we are particularly keeping our heritage in mind this morning. We are a congregation of the Reformation which started (in earnest) after the Holy Spirit led Martin Luther to re-discover the Gospel. **What a wonderful gift we have in the Gospel** and what wonderful opportunities God has given us to spread that Gospel message, for it's through that message of God's grace- his great love for us that through Christ he would forgive us- not something we have done or in fact could do, and he gives us that message through His Word (and Sacraments) which we take hold of through faith, that changes people's lives as it has indeed changed ours.

So we are using today to express our thanks in and through our giving.

Our **Thanksgiving Sunday** is an opportunity to give beyond our weekly offering - as an expression of thanks to God for his gift and for the work of our congregation to share that gift. So I encourage you to use this Thanksgiving Sunday as a means of thanking God for what he has done for you and will do through you.

And remember the challenge that Lauren Thiel announced a couple of Sunday's ago: an anonymous donor is prepared to match every dollar over \$5000 to an amount of \$5000!

Some of us may have forgotten that it is Thanksgiving Sunday today, so we are inviting you, who are not prepared for this Thanksgiving Sunday, to use the welcome sheet to make a pledge (that you intend to honour in the next few weeks). Don't forget you can notify REG to increase your giving for this Sunday as well- and will be included in our count.

Today we are also looking at **Martin Luther** in the context of our series "Saints Alive". Luther has been described in many ways. But a saint? When we see a saint as a person God has used or is using/someone set apart/who has traits that we can strive for, we can say, Yes.

And what was the trait he exemplified? Isn't it faith? I shall be depicting his **faith** as **courage, conviction and clarity** in the message this morning. These are gifts of God, given through His grace and are available for us today. We'll get to the heart of this **courage** from the **conviction** we have which comes from the **clarity** we received from God.

Thanks to our SCB school class who have provided a video on Luther's life for our service. (It was the one shown at our Friday morning service.)

I hope you have booked in to our Longest Lutheran Lunch today and indeed have invited others to join us

I have come back for this and our service this morning from **The Journey 2013 River camp** where we are studying "Faith in the World" (the Ten Commandments). Keep the young people preparing for the day of confirmation, the Schiller's who have provided the accommodation, Jason and a few youth who are leading them today in your prayers.

Next Sunday Ray Soekov (Deputy Principal of Endeavour) will be informing us of the latest at our sister school, Endeavour.

I strongly encourage you to get involved in our **Christmas program** in any way you can. Margey Knapp has written this brilliant play that we'll be using and Margot Mertin has agreed to direct it. It will be child friendly and I believe evangelism tool and a wonderful way to get involved in the life of the congregation.


