TWO MINUTES before Worship

Read John 18-

Some people think Judas' motive in betraying Jesus was not hate or greed, but impatience. Perhaps Judas had grown tired of waiting for Jesus to make a move, so he tried to force him to fight (18:1-3). "Use your power to set up a kingdom ... now!" Whatever Judas' motive may have been, things spiraled out of control.

The trial that followed was hardly the enactment of proper legal process. The religious leaders broke every rule of fairness, because they had already made up their minds about the verdict (18:30, 31). That's what happens when we let hate control us. If you have any unresolved anger in your life, you'd be wise to get to the bottom of it before it damages your relationship with others and with God.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, I want to be on the side of your truth. Help me to increase my ability to hear and my willingness to obey your voice.

A blessed Easter to you. What a wonderful series of worship experiences we have at Golden Grove Lutheran Fellowship!

Maundy Thursday on the theme: "Back to the upper room" (based on Mark 14:22-24) (Salt Factory band), our worship may hold some very interesting and challenging "surprises" for you. (Don't forget the all night youth run "Night to Remember" on tonight)

Good Friday- the theme is "On the cross" (based Mark 15:33-47) features the longer gospel read in dialogue form. The image of "darkness" will be a major focus for the address.

The Main Easter Service on the theme of "At the cemetery" (based Mark 16:4-8).

We are also holding a 6.15am Easter Dawn Service (the gates will be opened at 6.00am. This year it is being held at *Drumminor Gardens, Harrisons Funerals*. The theme at this cemetery is "On the way to the cemetery" (Mark 16:1-3). If you want to sit for this ½ hour service it may pay to bring a chair. Please consider how God has been moving in your life because at the dawn service there will be opportunity for you to give "a testimony". (Please let me know if you have something to say beforehand.) Hot Cross buns and tea/ coffee will be available in the gardens after the service. (As well as this...)

Hot Cross Buns breakfast at the church at 8.45pm prior to the main Easter service.

We welcomed into membership 7 people last Sunday: Maureen Welsch and Pat Stacey after completing the course "God For Us". Both Maureen and Pat come from a Roman Catholic background. We also welcomed Matthew Bishop a second year ALC student (studying to become a pastor) and his wife Melissa (a teacher at our school) and their family Eden, Gabby, Naomi (whom are all students at our school.) We extend to you our hand of fellowship and pray that you feel part of our church family and you use your gifts, to God's glory in our congregation.

From last week from the kid's craft table. What has rabbits got to do with Easter? I have been told: **Jump with Joy for Jesus!** Sounds great to me.

E100 Challenge beginning at GGLF on 6th May.

- E 100 Bible reading Challenge is a resource to help us get into reading our Bibles.
- It features 100 carefully selected readings designed to give people a good understanding of the Bible story.
- It encourages us to build a regular habit of spending time with God through prayer and Bible reading.
- We hope that individually we will use the devotion book (*Companion Book, cost: \$15*) as well as read our Bibles for 10 minutes every day (*Reading Planner \$4*). There is an app available for \$5

- I will preach on the theme each week for the 20 weeks of the Challenge.
- We'll read through the Old Testament from 6/5/12- 13/7/12 and we plan start the New Testament in September.

Paraments for Maundy Thursday Explanation of symbols

The actions of God are very prominent in the readings for Maundy Thursday. God is active, involved with His people and determined to save. This was enacted very simply when Jesus took off His outer garment, wrapped a towel around His waist and proceeded to wash His disciples' feet. This and His encouragement to His followers to do likewise, to serve each other out of love, is the basis for these paraments.

The silk floating pieces represent aprons and being ready for work inspired by Jesus with the towel around His waist. They are also the vehicle for the images of hands doing the tasks that Jesus did on that last night – washing, feeding, blessing, forgiving and interceding. They represent His very personal involvement with people then and through our Pastors now in the Worship Service, as they serve on His behalf. The movement of the fine silk in any air currents suggest the active nature of God's work in the present time and encourages us to be a part of this work of serving others - washing, feeding, blessing, forgiving and interceding as we have opportunity.

The crosses on the background reflect the 'great cloud of witnesses' that have gone before us, and that Jesus's loving actions are for individuals – people of every time and place and nation. The words chosen for the altar cloth are words spoken by Jesus at the institution of Holy Communion and emphasize the inclusive nature of His action as personal for everyone and for us collectively as a gathering of the Body of Christ.

The image and words on the lectern fall summarise the motives for Jesus's actions. It draws on a selection from the words He spoke as recorded in John 15 v 13, "There is no greater love than this – than a man will lay down his life for his friends." It sums up the loving devotion He and the Father have always had for their people and the length and breadth of the sacrifice Jesus willingly made to satisfy justice and secure the Father's grace and mercy for all. Jesus's heart is offered in outstretched hands as a symbol of His life offered firstly to His Father but also to each of us as an exchange – my life for yours.

Asaroka Phone System Installation Project

At a morning service during March it was shared that Peter the Principal at the Asaroka Secondary School has asked if we are able to send an expert to install the large phone system that was donated and went up in the container last year. The system is worth well in excess of \$20,000 and needs to be managed carefully. They are keen to have this running as it will give many benefits to the schools there and their operation in various ways.

Christiaan, a member of our congregation, who happens to be an "expert" in this area and was the actual person who did a great job in checking and preparing the phone system for shipment has now been asked to go to PNG to complete this project which we started last year. At this stage, he will be travelling with Daryl Trigg and Andrew Tiller who are planning a trip there in July to spend a few days with Peter and the teachers.

This is a Partnership project, with us sending Christiaan there to manage the installation and they need to provide other materials (cables, connections etc) ready for when he gets there.

We estimate that the cost will be about \$2500 and are appealing to members of the Congregation and School Families to try to raise this amount over the next few weeks so bookings can be made.

Money can be passed to Judith Whaites or via Daryl (if easier for school families) or put into the collection plates at services in an envelope marked 'Phone System At Asaroka'.
