Week 9— The Psalms & Proverbs

Overview

The writers of the Psalms describe every form of human emotion from the depths of despair to he heights of delight and joy. The book of Psalms teaches us a great deal about what an authentic relationship with God looks like. Although there are times when the writers bare their hearts before God in anguish and pain, there is also the constant theme of thanksgiving and praise as they learn that God can be relied on in times of trouble.

The book of Proverbs is full of wisdom and practical advice on how to lead a life that pleases God and avoid the pitfalls that we can so easily fall into.

Pastor's Column

Wasn't **the baptism last week** wonderful? I don't think I have ever baptised 4 people in one service before. As you probably could tell I was touched when Matthew (Gemma, Amee and Thomas Mann's father) was baptised. That baptism was most radical for me, too. It was one of the few times I could demonstrate **pure grace**. Matthew did nothing towards God's acceptance of him (no course of instruction in preparation for baptism. I will add though, that Matt was baptised with the understanding that he would study the inquirer's book "God for Us"- which I pray I may take him through when he is ready.) There was another baptism which I would put in the same category -back in Strathabyn: seventy five year old Max — who died within of a week of me baptising himbut that was most exceptional and other than the pure grace of that occasion too, there aren't too many other similarities.

Of course our challenge, as it is with every family who joins our congregation, (remember Diane, Matt's wife and the children's mother joined our congregation last Sunday too) is to connect with them- to encourage them, join with them and support them. As I said in my welcome to the Mann family into the congregation, I would expect them to also be welcomed into our **Fellowship Groups**. (I think it would be healthy to see Fellowship Groups "fighting over them").

Thank you too Diane and family, on behalf of the congregation, for the sumptuous morning tea you provided for us last week.

Welcome back from **Asaroka** the recent team that spent a week over there in PNG with the schools in which we are in partnership. I have heard it was a most beneficial trip in deepening our partnership together and installing the telephone system.

Seven nurses from Goroka are planning to visit us at the end of July (for a Lutheran Nurses course) and ten teachers from the Schools in Asaroka in September. We look forward to this "return visit".)

We are beginning Week 9 of the **E 100 Challenge** this week with the reading plan on Psalms and Proverbs. I am preaching this morning on the theme which I reckon unifies these passages: "**Words of Love**", in particular Psalm 23, 51 and 103 and selective parts of the Book of Proverbs. I hope that this is not just a study of these books but rather that I can help you to feel some of the love that God has for us as presented through these Words.

Over the last few weeks I have been inquiring about your opinion on just continuing the **E100 Challenge** into the New Testament (without having that 2 month break). It seems as though you would be quite in favour of continuing the Challenge through July, August and into September. So, next week the E100 Challenge is based on "The Prophets" and the week following week we start the New Testament with "The Living Word". The readings will continue to be on the back of the Weekly Bulletin.

I shall be away over the next 2 weeks (next week due to our District Synod in Alice Springs and the week following I am taking TOIL: days owing that I have accrued over the last year or so). Pastor Len will be leading the service next Sunday morning and Matt Bishop will be leading the service the week afterwards. (In this next section of the E 100 Challenge the guest preacher/speaker may not necessarily be basing his address of the E100 Challenge readings).

- A plan to help us develop a regular habit of spending time with God through prayer and Bible reading.
- 100 carefully selected readings designed to give us a good understanding of the Bible story.
- Bible readings listed on the back of each Bulletin and available from the display.
- 10 minutes each day (5 days a week) set aside to read
- The "Companion" (devotional) book is available when ordered for extra insights, (an *app* is available too).
- With the possibility of joining the Challenge any time.
