E100 Bible reading challenge

Week 9- The Prophets

Overview

We have come to a section of the Old Testament that is commonly referred to as the prophetic writings. These comprise approximately one third of the Bible. The prophetic writings are divided into two major sections: major prophets and minor prophets. We will first look at a prophecy of great significance which is found near the very middle of the Bible. Then we will focus on how three prophetic writers responded to their calling. We shall see that their response was not always a positive one, yet no matter what their response, God worked in and through them to achieve his purposes.
