Before Worship

Over these next few weeks the theme for our worship (both Sunday and Friday) is Service. The sermon this morning takes a closer look at the book of **Ruth** and "Service in kindness". We'll be looking at Ruth's loyalty, Boaz' protection and Naomi's wisdom, which can all be seen as aspects of kindness.

The Gospel reading for today (**Mark 10: 35-45**) is Jesus' response to James' and John's request to sit at either side of him "in his glory". He points them to servant-hood instead, and to himself as what being a servant looks like.

The first reading (**Job 38: 1-7**) continues the readings through the book of Job. The Lord finally speaks after Job had received all that counsel from his friends. This speech goes on for the next 4 chapters (It is stirring reading and I encourage you to take time to read it. It is very much the highlight of the book.) Simply put, God is asking: who gives anyone the right to question what He is doing? We need to trust God.

The second reading (**Hebrews 5:1-10**) again is continuing the readings from the last few weeks of the book of Hebrews. It is a description of Jesus, as high priest. Like every high priest, Jesus is able to empathize with those for whom he is interceding. What strikes me is that even Jesus needed to learn obedience ("Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered" Verse 8). This shows something about servant-hood. Yet, he is more than any human high priest. Jesus "became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey" (Verse 9).

Prayer: Father, thank you for Jesus- the source of eternal salvation. May we obey him and so be servants- showing the kindness and trust that you desire from us. We pray forgive us for the times we have attempted to "lord it over others". May we look to Jesus as our great high priest in our worship today and follow him as he shows us what it means to serve in kindness. Amen.

The challenge is really to prayerfully consider what you are willing to give in a one-off donation: if it is the full Day Pay Challenge (*Please see the article on this page*) or is God leading to only give a proportion of that? **Next Sunday** on our **Giving Sunday** – we encourage you to present your gifts to God.

Another event coming up this week is the **Mayor's Breakfast**. We have booked a table for 10 and we still have some seats available.

Our **Food Fun and Fellowship** raised between \$4000 and \$5000: earmarked for our Youth Worker's salary.

We need to thank God too for a **wonderful free will offering** we had last Sunday morning. It was 10 times more than what we have some Sunday mornings!

The FFF event is the last social occasion for the year. In 2 week's time we are again holding our **Longest Lutheran Lunch**. Keep your ears open for details.

This evening at Salt Factory we'll be **celebrating CPS Workers in the primary schools of our city of TTG**. Instead of one person giving the message we have Sheralyn Oakey, the Principal of the Heights Senior Campus speaking on the value of CPSWs; Andrew Jenkins our Schools Ministry Group rep giving an update; there will be testimonies from children on CPSWs; a few words from a couple of CPSWs, our Margot Mertin's installation as CPSW at Banksia Park Primary School as well as prayer for the 13 CPSWs and 2 Christian Option leaders that God has given to our city of TTG. I strongly encourage you to join with the (expected well over a hundred) visitors who will be coming to celebrate with us.

From our **Christmas Eve play meeting** that we held this last week we are confident that the Christmas play will go ahead. Do you want to be involved? We still have a few roles to be filled. Please contact Jeff Christensen if you are interested.

Next Sunday we continue our theme of Service. The address is based on Matthew 20:20-28: the mum's request. We'll use this to consider our **motive for giving**.

Day's Pay Challenge

Allow me to remind you of 7 points about this challenge:

It is a God pleasing habit to give a certain proportion of your income weekly to God (to "tithe") as reminder of his goodness to us and steady expression of thanks to Him.

But every so often we need to express our gratitude in a more dramatic way and that is what Day's Pay Challenge is all about.

It is also a way for our congregation to get rid of our deficit which we have heard recently has caused us dire concern.

Simply, the Day's Pay Challenge is to give how much you earn in one day.

One way of calculating this is by taking your annual salary (either gross or net- it is up to you) and dividing it by 200. Of course if your work is sporadic or part time or casual it is a bit more complicated. But the 200 rule on gross makes it simple. So if you earn \$40,000 a year, it would be \$200, \$50,000 it would be \$250, \$80,000 it would be \$400. If you get \$10 pocket money a week it would be \$2.50, if you are on the average wage for an Australian worker (of \$1352 a week) then it would be about \$250, if you are on a pension it would be about \$100.

Please use an envelope and mark it as Day Pay Donation (or DPD) and place it in the offering plate next Sunday 28th Oct or on another Sunday if that date doesn't suit. If you want to do it through REG, just put a note in the envelope indicating this so we can celebrate what Day Pay Challenge has meant for our congregation.

This is your challenge. It is between you and God- an expression of thanks to God and it's a means to showing your love for this congregation.
