WELCOME to all worshipping with us today

Greetings to any visitors here with us. We are pleased to have you join us and we trust you have felt welcomed and pray the Holy Spirit may enlighten and empower us with the message shared today.

Before Worship

In the Gospel reading for today (**Mark 13:1-8**) Jesus responds to the disciples comment about the "massive stones" and "magnificent buildings" of the temple precinct in Jerusalem with a description of the signs before the last times. His description continues through the rest of the chapter (which I believe you would find interesting to read sometime). It reminds us that we are not only near the end times but we are approaching the end of the church year when we traditionally hear these readings.

In the second reading from the book of Hebrews (again) (Hebrews 10:11-14, 19-25) Jesus' is designated as the priest through whom we have "confidence to enter the most Holy Place" by his blood. With that thought the writer encourages us to "draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience."(verse 22) and he continues: "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful". (verse 23)

The first reading for today is a declaration of who we are (**1 Peter 2:1-9**), on which I shall be basing my message this morning, in particular verse 9: "you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession". It is a struggle to realize this is in fact who we really are. But Peter gives us some ideas in this passage of how we can take hold of this claim. Listen for three things Peter says in the first few verses of this passage: take off, crave, come to. It's these directions that I shall be elaborating on in the message. (We have replaced the reading for the day (1 Samuel 1:14-20) with this passage to follow the theme of "our struggles").

Prayer: Father, thank you that you sent Jesus not only to be the great high priest to open up the way for our worship this morning, but to teach us about the last times and to reassure us about who we are. Help us to take off all that keeps us from you, to crave what you want to give to us and to come into an even closer relationship with you Amen.

Pastor's Column

As I stated "Before Worship..." the theme for this morning's worship is "**The struggle with who we are**." It is the third in a series on *Our struggles* (the other sermons- "The struggle with freedom" and "The struggle with grace" is available from our website and in hard copy, on request.)

Geoff Thiel will be speaking in this morning's service on the presentation (we saw a few weeks ago) entitled "**Christian Giving**".

This evening at Salt Factory I shall be speaking on "Why do you give?" and Lauren Thiel will be speaking on that "Christian

Giving" presentation.

We shall be having **Holy Communion** this morning because (to our knowledge) there won't be any ordained pastors available to lead Holy Communion next Sunday.

Over the last couple of weeks I have been advertising a DAY OF REPENTANCE which will be held on Saturday, 1st December.

It is an opportunity to come on your own or with others to repent of your own sins and the "sins of the community" (I call these "*corporate sins*": sins that we are guilty of because we belong to a body and in our case it's our congregation.)

I am preparing some resources for the occasion which will be available from the small chapel on the Day of Repentance. But I am also asking for any **prayer requests** that you might like to submit. We do ask you though, to be sensitive and gracious in what you write. Yet we do encourage you to contribute to the day in this way, especially if God has put on your heart certain corporate sins which we need to present to God in prayer.

Remember this Day of Repentance will be centred on the Small Chapel (the code **C 289 5033**- Just turn off the light, put out any candles, leave it in the condition you found it and close the door when you leave.) If an overflow is required, we can use the Fellowship Lounge, Pastor's Church Study and Fellowship Centre as well. You are also welcome to the Prayer Garden via the GOSH gate (Code 5127). Feel free to come any time during the day and stay as long as you like.

Heidi and I shall be away next weekend. We will be attending the 60th anniversary celebrations at **Calvary Yarraman** (Qld) - a congregation in my first parish, at which I shall be preaching. Next Sunday **Graham Pfeffer** will be preaching here. He is receiving his preaching licence this coming Friday so it will be the first sermon he will have preached in a congregation! The theme of the sermon is "The Blood that cleanses" based on Hebrews 9: 11-14.

In two week's time we are holding our **Annual Church/ School picnic** (our "family fun day') - 2nd December. *Our morning worship will be a little different:* We begin as normal with a half hour DVD ("**Jacob's gift**"- suitable for all the family) then morning tea and the R/1 school led family service then starts at 10.30am.
