

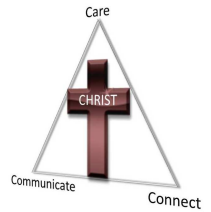

TWO MINUTES

Jesus appears to his disciples; Jesus appears to Thomas

Jesus did many other miraculous signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name. John 20:30-31

Picture the scene – nervous men, locked doors, discussion in low voices about the events that had recently happened. Then Jesus appears among them! Now picture scene two (a week later) - doors locked again, still a level of tension for fear of the Jews, this time the sceptical Thomas is present. Then Jesus appears among them again and turns to Thomas repeating word for word Thomas' doubts and showing them to be unwarranted.

In this Gospel, John has recorded the miraculous signs and wonders of Jesus much like a lawyer reporting evidence. We have first-hand witnesses – John, Thomas, the other disciples. We have evidence – scar tissue from nail wounds and scar tissue from the spear wound in Jesus' side. And we have a motive – 'that you may believe... and that by believing you may have life!' John is showing us the truth, the facts, that this man Jesus is the Messiah. He is the Son of God. And through Him we have eternal life.

Dear Father in Heaven, we are convinced that you are the Christ. Help us to speak this message clearly to others and share with our families and friends, our workmates and colleagues the good news of your salvation. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.

Pastor's Column

I praying that you are having a **blessed Easter** (The season of Easter continues till Pentecost – 12th June.) and that the Easter weekend was a deep and meaningful experience for you. May you know that “the veil is torn”, “Jesus is with you” and that each day “you live in all that Jesus’ suffering and death gained for you”- the forgiveness, the freedom and the hope for the future (that certainty that God has the future in his hands.)

This morning we are going to take up the Gospel Reading: John 20:19-31 and in particular **verse 21**: *Again Jesus said, “Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.”* with the theme: **“Sent to forgive”**. We'll be looking at the depth, the joy and the peace this command gives.

Next Sunday we are having a **special Mother's Day service**. I hope that all the congregation and school will ask their mothers to attend. One way we are making this special is by having pictures of your mum on the screen during the service (like we did 4 years ago). So please email your mother's photo into the Church Office (or drop a hard copy in which we will scan) sometime this week (earlier the better).

As you can see from the **“Meetings this week”**, after the school holidays we are back into meetings. The Vision For Ministry and the Management team meeting may be the last ones if the proposed restructure for our leadership at the AGM goes ahead. Please see the **AGM reports**- out next Sunday, for details.

I include the **PrayTTG prayer/breakfast** in meetings for this week because it is open to leaders in our congregation and this month we are hosting it. Also I include the **School's Ministry TTG meeting** in as well. We are looking for more members on this committee. If you would like to know more about it or would like to come along to see what we do, please see me. **The Journey** is our name for the confirmation course (aimed at those in year 7). **Ministry of Care** is for everyone (who has a caring role in our congregation- which I think that is about everyone). It is run by the Pastoral Carers for the congregation. I have also included our **Friday morning worship** (with the School community) in the list of meetings because that is the third worship service of the congregation and I think they are wonderful.

I will repeat again what I included in last week's Bulletin: please note that after using the ONE YEAR PSALMS AND NEW TESTAMENT readings we are going back to the **ONE YEAR BIBLE**. See the back page of this Bulletin for the readings for this week. Why not take up Bible reading everyday and perhaps even journaling. 
