

### **TWO MINUTES**

1 Peter 4:8-10

"Be self controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith. And the God of grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore you and make you strong."

As Christians, we don't often speak about the way we should live our lives. Most often we speak about God's overflowing grace and his abundance of love he has for us. Although God is willing to give us so much, we all begin to build barriers between ourselves and God because of the sin in our lives. Our enemy, the devil, is always on the prowl to find ways to make us feel guilty, to make us feel unworthy, and to make us doubt God's promises. It is for this reason that we should resist the desires of this world, despise what God despises, and love what he loves. God has a plan and a purpose for your life and this does not include being caught up in the wrong crowd and living according to your own desires. Be self controlled and alert and God will restore you to a place with him in eternal glory. Be wise then and spend time with those who will build you up and not tear you down. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit are in perfect community, so what makes us think we should be any different? Become a part of the community within the church who can help you fight the enemy and grow closer to Christ who desires a close relationship with you.

Prayer: Father God, I ask that you guide us into supportive Christian communities. May we have strong friends to walk beside us on this journey through life and keep us on the path of goodness, purity and love. Show us your purpose for our lives and never let us forget the promises you have given to us. Help us to resist the devil by staying self controlled and alert and remind us of your love and forgiveness through Christ who died for us.

# Pastor's Column

Has it ever struck you that the God who is above is the God who is close by? This is what the Psalmist says (**Psalm 68:4-6**). This Psalm is the designated psalm for today (in the church calendar it is called the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Easter). The 'indescribable God" is the God who is intimately involved in our lives. We'll see just what that means for us this morning. Also we shall consider a way of thinking about God in our society today which I call seeing God as the "Mediocre God."

Today is also the Sunday after the **Ascension** (Ascension Thursday which has been called the "cinderella of the church festivals" was last week). Don't worry if you didn't celebrate it because we shall be doing that this evening at the **Salt Factory worship**. The text we'll be looking at is **Acts 1: 1-11** and asking what does Jesus' ascension mean for you?

Wasn't the **School Family Service**, led by the 4/5 cluster on the topic of 'Worship", last Sunday wonderful? **Congratulations** to the teachers, Daryl and the students. A real credit to the School!

I mentioned last week that we shall be getting into the book "Better together" - the participants' guide for the 40 days of community, over the next few months. This will be featured at our Fellowship Group leaders meeting after worship today. I hope every Fellowship Group is represented. You don't have to be a leader or even involved in a Fellowship Group to attend. You are more than welcome to attend if you are interested in looking at the book or the 40 days of Community.

Don't forget about the **River Murray Fishing Trip** next week. We are also celebrating **Pentecost** in the morning. And of course there will be Salt Factory worship in the evening- but no Salt Factory dinner- being a long weekend.

As well as that, you are welcome to attend a special Pentecost service at **St Mark's Anglican Church** (The Golden Way) at 6pm, which focuses on the work we are doing in schools through our Christian Pastoral Support Workers which will incorporate the commissioning of the 4 newest CPSWs in our TTG area. I shall be involved in that worship.
