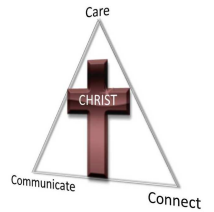

TWO MINUTES

Romans 8

¹ Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, ² because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death.

A couple of weeks ago I happened to be reading an online debate about faith and religion ("debate" being a very polite term). One person made the point that God's love is a gift not a reward, and that there is no amount of good deeds a person can do to receive God's love.

To this, the following response came: "**Wait and you're completely morally at ease with that?**". This person then proceeded to question that a person who is a "useless waste of air" but completes the rituals that God dictates could go to heaven over a person who spends their entire life trying to make the world a better place, but is castigated for their non-belief.

Generally, I stay away from these arguments because they usually end up being a non-structured and inappropriate attack on religion (and I'm normally not confident in defending my faith). For some reason, I decided to no longer be a spectator in this particular thread, and wrote a response to this second person's comments:

"People are born into sin, therefore without God's forgiveness, they fall short of God's requirement of perfection to enter heaven. Sin has also corrupted the world so that people do not always have that personal relationship with God (e.g. simply not being aware of God's existence). So yes, a person can spend a lifetime doing things that are "good" in nature, but that person is still unable to enter heaven.

Ultimately, when looking at the big picture (i.e. life), there is no balance. God has ultimate power, ultimate victory over evil, and ultimate judgement. **And I am completely comfortable with that judgement.** What I should not be "morally" comfortable with is that so many people look to end up on the wrong side of that judgement, and the question is how I can help change that with my life."

Security System at GGLPS/GGLF

Some changes have been implemented to (hopefully) improve our security system arrangements.

- ◆ Name changes have been made to the following areas: Fellowship and Worship have been combined as F/Ship & Worship ie both will always be armed and disarmed at the same time. Admin is now Music & Japanese. New Admin is now Admin
- ◆ The security system will automatically alarm all areas at 11pm every night. This is to ensure that all areas are armed overnight. Notwithstanding this areas not being attended should be armed at all times after hours and weekends – no change to the current system. If you require any area after 11pm please advise Daryl or Graeme in advance and/or the Monitoring Centre. The area(s) required will be able to disarmed manually using your key pad code immediately after automatic arming by the system.
- ◆ As usual we request that you immediately contact one of the following in event of setting off an alarm (alarms): Daryl on 0422572992 or Graeme on 0419828091.
Mark Rawolle 0400251344 or Leon Rosenberg 0432224721 can be contacted if both Daryl and Graeme are away from home.
- ◆ The Monitoring Centre number is 1300 325 678.
- ◆ When an alarm is set off all sirens will go off at once.
- ◆ Key Pad Codes will remain unchanged – these are never to be shared. In event that you contact the monitoring centre they will ask for your voice code – which is your Christian and Surname initials followed by the last 2 numbers of your key pad code.
- ◆ Key pads will emit a beeping sound prior to you disarming that area at that key pad.

Please do not hesitate to contact me if any of the above requires clarification or expansion.
