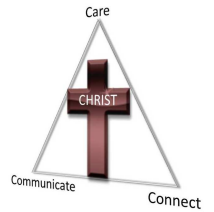

TWO MINUTES

Matt 13:24-30, The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field, but while his men were sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat and went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared also. And the servants of the master of the house came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? How then does it have weeds?' He said to them, 'An enemy has done this.' So the servants said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' But he said, 'No, lest in gathering the weeds you root up the wheat along with them. Let both grow together until the harvest, and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Gather the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.' "

The parable of the wheat and weeds describes the human experience of reality as a mixture of good and evil people. The task is not for the good to try to destroy the evil, but to wait patiently for God to do it. Sometimes God's justice seems to take a long time, because God is patient and kind. We should learn from Jesus to treat those who differ from us with gentleness and patience. One aspect that is overlooked is that what happens to the field, and in the world, also happens within each of us. "We can also grow impatient with God when our prayers to uproot some personal weed seems to go unanswered.... But God will not uproot the wheat of your survival to get at the weed of your fury."

Security System at GGLPS/GGLF

Some changes have been implemented to (hopefully) improve our security system arrangements.

- ◆ Name changes have been made to the following areas: Fellowship and Worship have been combined as F/Ship & Worship ie both will always be armed and disarmed at the same time. Admin is now Music & Japanese. New Admin is now Admin
- ◆ The security system will automatically alarm all areas at 11pm every night. This is to ensure that all areas are armed overnight. Notwithstanding this areas not being attended should be armed at all times after hours and weekends – no change to the current system. If you require any area after 11pm please advise Daryl or Graeme in advance and/or the Monitoring Centre. The area(s) required will be able to disarmed manually using your key pad code immediately after automatic arming by the system.
- ◆ As usual we request that you immediately contact one of the following in event of setting off an alarm (alarms): Daryl on 0422572992 or Graeme on 0419828091.
Mark Rawolle 0400251344 or Leon Rosenberg 0432224721 can be contacted if both Daryl and Graeme are away from home.
- ◆ The Monitoring Centre number is 1300 325 678.
- ◆ When an alarm is set off all sirens will go off at once.
- ◆ Key Pad Codes will remain unchanged – these are never to be shared. In event that you contact the monitoring centre they will ask for your voice code – which is your Christian and Surname initials followed by the last 2 numbers of your key pad code.
- ◆ Key pads will emit a beeping sound prior to you disarming that area at that key pad.

Please do not hesitate to contact me if any of the above requires clarification or expansion.
