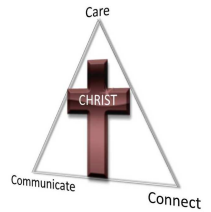

TWO MINUTES

I was pondering the Gospel story and thinking about the use of this phrase, 'walk on water' in our society today. It is in general use and equated with the impossible even by those who don't know this story.

It is easy for us as Christians to accept that Jesus could walk on water, yet in this storm we have Peter literally, physically, actually, really walking on water, until he lost sight of Jesus that is.

So often we try to secure our own righteousness 'Moses' way, or by obeying the law. Romans 10 v 5 quotes, "The man who does these things will live by them." Yet as Paul implies it is impossible to do this. If we try to save ourselves by obeying the law we'll need to be able to do the impossible, or be absolutely perfect because the law will be our judge.

Yet if we choose the righteousness of Christ, we have passed from judgement to life. And we, like Peter and at Jesus' invitation will walk on water – the water of baptism and we will be saved. Is that difficult to believe? What did Peter do when he was in doubt about his safety? He called out, "Lord, save me", and Jesus did.

Lord Jesus, take us by the hand and help us see our feet are safe and secure, walking on the waters of baptism through the storm that is our life, because it is what You have done that saves us. Thanks and praise to You alone. Amen.
