TWO MINUTES

Where do you stand in respect of Jesus?

Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!" Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns." (Matt 16:22, 23)

I've heard this passage depicted as Peter trying to walk beside Jesus and Jesus having to put him in his place: Walk behind me- follow me, Peter. This week in our School we have been looking at Jesus calling his disciples, under the title "Let's Go" (from the book "The Jesus story book Bible" by Sally Lloyd Jones) – into a life of "running free in an open field", which we call discipleship. Now, a disciple follows the teacher: learns from him by watching him, listening to him, living with him. And this was to be Peter's position.

But Peter took it upon himself to walk beside Jesus. He had the audacity to take Jesus aside and rebuke him. What was this over? It was Jesus prophesying what was going to happen to him (verse 21). Peter could not take it that Jesus had to suffer and die. Obviously that wasn't the type of Messiah that Peter wanted to follow. There must be an alternative. It sounds very much like Satan tempting Jesus in the wilderness (See Matthew 4) and Jesus heard it that way too. That is the reason for Jesus' strong response. "You are a stumbling block to me".

But there is another aspect of this that perhaps might strike us even deeper. Peter didn't like the sound of suffering *per se*. Since Peter was a disciple of Jesus: what happens to the teacher would happen to him ... and he didn't want to suffer.

Can't we relate to this? Do we want to suffer? I don't think so. And we tell God precisely that, don't we?

But suffering may be part of God's plan for us. Last Sunday (at Salt Factory) we had a closer look at the ONE YEAR BIBLE reading for the day: Job 1-3 and heard again that there are some benefits in suffering. (See Romans 5:3; 1 Peter 1:6, 7.)

Yet isn't our response to be (like Job and) trust our Father and even when, like Peter, we step out of line, to accept the rebuke and take our place behind him again receiving his forgiveness, learning from him as his disciple and knowing that we are protected because Jesus walks before us-to prepare the way?

It's a good question: Where do you stand in respect to Jesus? I hope you find your place once again this morning in our worship.

Let's Pray: Father, forgive us, teach us, protect us through Jesus, our Saviour. May we once more discover our place today: behind Jesus- as his disciples- trusting that he has best in mind for us- "running free in an open field". Amen.

A sincere welcome to you today.

It appears in the second reading this morning (Romans 12:9) in fact as an expression of love it summarizes all that follows (verses 9-21), it appeals to young people who are about to be married (I have often used it as a wedding text) and yet it is a test for our love (taking up the Message translation) it asks us whether we are faking it!

We are going to take up thee aspects of this text this morning in the address under the title" "Love must be sincere. I believe it is a most interesting way to look at ourselves, what we do and at God.

As you would have read in the insert in last week's bulletin one of the teachers at our school (Suz Brook) will be travelling to Burundi & Kenya in September as part of an ALWS team. We are fortunate to have Suz with us this morning and she will share a little about that trip and how we can play a part in helping and afterwards we shall pray for this in the General Prayers.

This evening **Paul Napier** is speaking at Salt Factory, again on the topic of healing. I understand he has some very interesting stories and video clips of God's miraculous healing in Papua New Guinea. Paul will be giving an opportunity at the end of his talk for people to come forward for prayer for healing.



LCC Winter Appeal


