



TWO MINUTES

To judge or not to judge

Romans 14: 1, 4, 7-8

Accept him whose faith is weak, without passing judgement on disputable matters...Who are you to judge someone else's servant?...For none of us lives to himself alone and none of us dies to himself alone. If we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord.

It's human nature - we constantly make assessments on others. What they say. What they wear. What they do. Everything and anything falls prey to our 'we-know-what's best' judgement. We're quick to judge...too quick ...and then, just sometimes, we find out later that there are circumstances which throws our criticism smack bang into our face with a healthy sense of shame. Today's passage from Romans warns us about judging others. It reminds us that none of us lives to himself, none of us dies to himself. In other words, it says to us in a loud voice 'who do we think we are!?' And it reminds us to live, not judgmentally and critically, but with love, serving the Lord and giving thanks for all he provides.

Heavenly Father, You created all people and they are all precious in your sight. Remind us of your great love when we tend to be critical and judgemental. Assist us to live fully for you. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen. Tania Nelson

Pastor's Column

On the wings of an eagle. This is what we are celebrating in September. The beautiful banner that Susanne Trigg has made for us for his celebration says it all: REFRESH, RENEW, SOAR, RECHARGE, RESTORE, REVIVE. This is what we feel we need. This is our heartfelt prayer, our desire, our hope. Can you see symbols of the Holy Spirit, joy, life, wonder, openness and growth on the banner? May the words of the song- our theme song for the month: "*Come live in me, all my life take over, come breath in me and I will rise on eagles' wings*" be your prayer throughout this month and... throughout your life.

They are the very words I presented last week to begin this column. Some of you might have missed it. I pray that you plan to get the most out of this festival and you are truly open to God to lift you "on eagle's wings". Next week Pastor Peter Steicke will be leading the morning service and preaching on the theme "Renewed", based on Isaiah 40:31a. I shall take up the same theme that evening at Salt Factory.

Today the theme is "**Strength for the Weary**", based on Isaiah 40:29, 30: *He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall*" This message is a for all who are feeling weary and weak... worn out... don't feel like going on...fatigued and wondering what's the use... tired or depressed... We are going to consider how we take hold of the strength God offers. A couple of clues: it has to do with the means God has so readily made available (but which we have often overlooked), it has to do with faith and it will also involve something a little bit different in our sermon today!

This morning are also celebrating Patrick Lukas Pena's **baptism**. Lisa and Eduardo (who are still members here at GGLF) have coming from Perth to celebrate this with you- their church family.

Speaking of family (and not being weary), the Rosenberg family is walking/running/crawling in the "**City to Bay**" run in 2 week's time to raise money for Downs Syndrome. (You might know Jackson – our grandson: he comes along to Mainly Music and is enrolled in our School.) As part of our celebration, "On the wings of an eagle", you will have opportunity with a "**retiring offering for ALWS**" each Sunday, for people who are weary with hunger and sickness (Sorry we didn't give you more warning last Sunday). 
