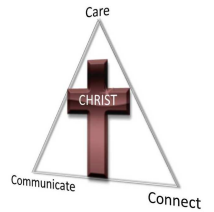

Pastor's Column

Welcome to our worship today. What are you wearing? We can answer this in a few different ways. You can be quite literal about your answer. You might feel a little uncomfortable and wonder what I am getting at- maybe even offended- what am I insinuating? Or this may challenge you when you consider what are the "spiritual clothes" you are wearing or could be wearing.

God provides clothes for you. We'll see what they look like in the address. But the question for you is, have you put them on? "**What are you wearing?**" This is the theme for today's address, based on the Gospel reading for today Matthew 22:1-14, in particular verses 11 and 12: "*But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing wedding clothes. 'Friend,' he asked, 'how did you get in here without wedding clothes?' The man was speechless.*" The address will look at what's going on here and what's going on amongst God's people today.

Next Sunday (and in the week following) you will be asked to fill in the **National Church Life Survey**. This is census across all churches including the Catholic, Anglican, Uniting, Baptists Salvation Army, Church of Christ and many Pentecostal churches. The NCLS is the largest and longest running survey- it's been going since 1991 and is held every 5 years. The NCLS is a valuable opportunity for us to reflect on our life and health and learn from other churches. It also contributes to understanding the role of churches and their attenders in the Australian community. It will take between 15 and 20 minutes to fill in so we are reducing the length of the service and the address and adults will be asked to fill it in at our Friday morning worship. If your **Fellowship Group meets next week or you belong to a team which Pastor is not attending** we ask leaders to get hold of survey forms (from Pastor) for those who haven't filled them in to do so (**Note: you only fill it in once**).

As I said last Sunday, please note on **6th November** we will be having a discussion at the Salt Factory worship on **Where are we going with Salt Factory in 2012?** Please plan to be there and to contribute to the discussion.

Another reminder: I am thinking of running a **Bethel Bible Study** course in 2012 and 2013. Bethel is a course that gives an overview of the whole Bible. It takes about 2 years to complete. It will cost \$20 a term. (Each term is "stand alone".) I will only be running it if I get enough interest and commitment. For more information on Bethel look it up on the web.

You will notice that there are some **very interesting meetings coming up this next week**. On Monday the Pastoral Carers are looking for ways to better care for our congregation through Fellowship Groups. Come along if you are interested. On Tuesday night, again the emphasis is on Home Fellowship Groups. In this meeting we are continuing to explore how to energize our Fellowship groups. At our last meeting we decided to invite our Mission Director to give a presentation on Small Groups on a Sunday morning. Again come along. If you are interested in the work of Christian Pastoral Support Workers in our Public Schools then SMTTG may be for you. We meet this Wednesday. Let me know if you are coming. We haven't forgotten about Willow Creek's Global Leadership Summit. It's at the end of this week. You need to book in now if you are going.
