Pastor's Column

Thank you for joining us today in worship. Today we are having shorter services so that we can fill in the National Church Life Survey which also means that the address will be shorter one.

Today we shall have a closer look at the first reading: Exodus 33: 12-23 to allow God to give us some insights into Himself, as He reveals his goodness to Moses (who wanted to see His face).

Today (and during this following week - if you don't get to do it today, and including our Friday morning worship- for all adults present) you will be asked to fill in the National Church Life **Survey**. This is a census across all churches including the Catholic. Anglican, Uniting, Baptists, Salvation Army, Church of Christ and many Pentecostal churches. The NCLS is the largest and longest running survey of it's kind- it's been going since 1991 and is held every 5 years. The NCLS is a valuable opportunity for us to reflect on our life and health and learn from other churches. It also contributes to understanding the role of churches and their attenders in the Australian community. It will take between 15 and 20 minutes to fill in. If your Fellowship Group meets next week or you belong to a team which Pastor is not attending, we ask leaders to get hold of survey forms (from Pastor) for those who haven't filled them in to do so (Again Note: you only fill it in once).

At the top of the form there is a space for the congregational code. Our code is **L A 4 1 1 3 0 1**

Next Sunday, God willing Abbey Rathjen (Malcolm and Claire's daughter) will be baptised in the morning service, the Journey (confirmation) will be starting again and Paul Napier will be speaking at Salt Factory worship.

Why you should go to Holy Communion?

After we re-visited the subject of Holy Communion in class, I asked the guys on "The Journey" (the 2011/2012 confirmation class) to encourage people to come to Communion and these were their responses:

- I would encourage someone to go to Holy Communion by going with them and supporting them and explaining that Communion means God's body and blood shed for us for the forgiveness of sins.
- I should go because it reminds me that Jesus died on the cross and he gave me his body and blood for me and it represents that our sins are forgiven.
- You should go to Holy Communion so you can receive Jesus' body and blood in you because we believe and should eat and drink and keep Jesus in your memory for dying on the cross and giving us eternal life.
- I think you should go because it signifies that you believe in God and that you respect him.
- Because you need to be forgiven for your sins.
- It helps you understand and become closer to God and learn how much he does for us and become holy.
- We should go to Holy Communion to receive forgiveness from God to admit that we have done something wrong. We should go to think about what we have done and connect personally with God.
- Holy Communion means eating the body and the blood of Jesus, having your sins taken away and being wiped clean, praising the Lord and letting him know that you have done something wrong and asking for his forgive-

(I highlighted those comments that I thought most profound.) It makes you think doesn't it? The guys on the Journey, God willing will be confirmed on 19th February 2012.

Christmas hampers in the metropolitan and Barossa area. To meet the anticipated demand this year we are asking congregations to begin collecting food, books and toys for disadvantaged families. LCC has provided a list of required foods for the Metropolitan region. The Christmas Hamper food list is displayed in our church

The books may be small colouring-in books, a reading book for older children, or a cloth book for a young child. A book with a Christian theme would be great. We ask that toys be purchased new and could include Lego, balls, musical toys, etc. We prefer them not to be a soft toy.
