TWO MINUTES

Matthew 25:14-30

The Parable of the Bags of Gold Extracts from Matthew Henry's Commentary BibleGateway.com

We have here the parable of the *talents* committed to three servants; this implies that we are in a state of work and business, as the former implies that we are in a state of expectancy. *That* showed the necessity of habitual preparation, *this* of actual diligence in our present work and service. In *that* we were stirred up to do well for our own souls; in *this* to lay out ourselves for the glory of God and the good of others.

That those who have least to do for God, frequently do least of what they have to do. Some make it an excuse for their laziness, that they have not the opportunities of serving God that others have; and because they have not wherewithal to do what they say they would, they will not do what we are sure they can, and so sit down and do nothing; it is really an aggravation of their sloth, that when they have but one talent to take care about, they neglect that one.

He hid his *lord's* money; had it been his *own*, he might have done as he pleased; but, whatever abilities and advantages we have, they are not our *own*, we are but stewards of them, and must give account to our Lord, whose goods they are.

What charge we receive from God, what work we do for God in this world, is but little, very little, compared with *the joy set before us.* Put together all our service, all our sufferings, all our improvements, all the good we do to others, all we get to ourselves, and they are but a few things, next to nothing, not worthy to be compared, not fit to be named the same day with the glory to be revealed.

13/11/11

Today we are taking a closer look at the Gospel reading for the day: **Matthew 25:14-30**: Jesus' parable of the bags of gold, in the message: "**What are you going to show when Jesus comes back?**" We'll discover what are our bags of gold and then we'll consider the key to this parable: What is your view of God?

Over this weekend of confirmees are away on the **Journey camp**. We are studying what it means to grow in faith in the world, by allowing God to show us what the Ten Commandments mean for us, as well as learning how to witness and serve.

We welcome the Principal of Endevour College, **Heather Voigt**to our worship this morning. Heather has come to keep us in touch with Endevour College with which we are in partnership (through LENS), which is a feeder school for our own primary campus and where number of our members are students, teachers or staff.

At Salt Factory this evening **Suz Brooks** who spoke to us several weeks ago about going over to Africa as part of a team representing ALWS will lead worship in which she will be sharing some of her experiences from her time over therewith us. Make sure you plan to come. It is bound to be a most confronting worship experience.


