Pastor's Column

Today we shall be installing our school staff and following today's service a lunch for all GGLPS staff members and School Council will be held in the Fellowship Centre. I am taking up the theme of the year at our school: **Finding God in the little things**, which we used on a retreat a couple of weeks ago. We seem to be more likely to recognize God in the big things: the dramatic natural phenomena such as sunrises and thunderstorms, in miracles and God-incidences (coincidences where God's will is done) rather than in the little things- those things we tend to take for granted? How can we be more sensitive to the little things and find God there- or better put (theologically) allow God to find us there?

The last in our DVD series "**Out of the Valley**" is on tonight. This being the last in this current series (and since our school in back) we are starting with a Salt Factory dinner.

Please take note and either keep or pass onto a friend the flyer promoting *our new Bible study class*, entitled **LOGOS**. This course will commence next Sunday and be run most Sundays from 11am-12.30pm (see the dates on the flyer). Come along and grow.

Confirmation starts again this coming week for the group that met throughout last year. This Saturday it is a *Day Camp* to prepare the 11 young people for the day of their confirmation. We shall be looking at "Back to our baptism" and why they are going to be confirmed; "Our faith today" and come up with an "*I believe*" statement for the day of confirmation; "The future" and what confirmation is going to mean for them in their faith journey and "The rite of confirmation" to see what the worship service actually means. This day camp includes an interview to ascertain whether the confirmer is ready to be confirmed and we'll be talking about what the confirmer would like to see on the day of their confirmation and what "confirmation text" they would like as well as having some fun time with Rev320 leaders. Yes – all of this in this one day. (The day of confirmation is 28th February.)

Next Sunday we are going to look at the next part of "Creating Confidence to Share your Faith" with: **Getting the facts straight**. We'll be looking at the Gospel and how to present it. Also next Sunday **Scarlett Dohnt** is becoming a member of GGLF through Holy Baptism. Her brother Mason was baptized here about 14 months ago.

In a fortnight we are celebrating our **Thanksgiving Service**. The theme for this year is "*Thank God for Family and Friends*".

Lent will soon be upon us: *Ash Wednesday is 17th February*. We shall be holding an Ash Wednesday service with Holy Communion as we normally do at 7pm that evening. But I am also thinking of holding a half hour devotion every Wednesday evening during Lent - what do you think?

With the small chapel being used as a uniform shop from March to October while our new School Admin Building is being constructed, it was suggested that we "de-consecrate" the small chapel. This will occur near the end of February.

NEW ADMIN BUILDING

Most GGLF members will be aware that a new administration block for GGLPS and GGLF will be constructed during 2010. God (and Ivan) willing, it should be near completion in October!!

The building process means that we lose over 300 square metres during this time. As you can imagine, this is quite problematic for a school.

Some of the ways we are overcoming this are...


- Hiring a P.O.D – located between the shed and the Fellowship Center, this will house materials from the art room.
- Utilising the area behind the church pigeon holes – Japanese class has been displaced and does not have a classroom and so lessons on Wed and Thursday will be held in the entrance of the church. We have made some realignments of the pigeon hole area to accommodate this.
- GGOSH – has moved to the JP block and one of the JP classes have relocated to the Japanese room.

However, we are yet to relocate the Uniform room.

Following consultation with the Uniform Shop ladies and the GGLF management committee, we are hoping it is OK with the Fellowship to locate the uniform shop in the 'Chapel' until the stage 5 Administration building is complete.

If you have any feedback about this direction could you please communicate with Daryl Trigg as soon as possible. The builders have notified us that we need to be out of the art/ GGOSH/uniform rooms by the end of February.
