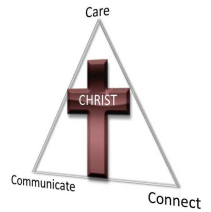

TWO MINUTES

1 Kings 17:8-16; Gal 1:11-24; Luke 7:11-17

One of the themes of this Sunday's readings is the power of the Word of God that leads to new life. The widow of Zarephath was commanded by 'the Lord, the God of Israel' through Elijah to feed Elijah as well as her son and herself. The widow's obedience led to a new life, and a bottomless jar of flour and oil!

Paul, as recorded in Galatians, tells of his conversion, not through testimonies from men, but through a direct 'revelation from Jesus Christ.' The Word of God had powerful ramifications for the over-zealous, Christian-hating Paul.

Luke records in Chapter 7 the first of three instances of Jesus raising someone from the dead, in this case the only son of a widow. Jesus' words, "Young man, I say to you, get up!" must have caused quite a stir amongst the mourners! The power of the Word of God created life in the young man and creates life today.

Dear God, your Word is powerful and creates new life. Help us to share your Word through our homes, our communities and into the world. Amen.

Pastor's Column

We welcome Heidi and Michael, Cassandra and all the rest of the family and their friends for **Indy's Blue Cook's Baptism** this morning.

Today we start the second part of our sermon series "**Grow in faith**" as we look in particular at **Prayer**. We'll define what prayer is, we'll consider how people have developed a strong prayer life and we'll look at 12 different means to help us pray. *Two reasons it seems why we don't pray more is cynicism and forgetting.*

In the sermon I refer to a book. It's **Paul E Miller in his book "A praying life"** which will soon be available from our library.

During this month I am encouraging you to **give your story about how God has answered your prayers**. So please pray about standing up one Sunday and sharing this with the congregation. It may be a dramatic answer to prayer or a simple way God moved, something that changed your life or changed the moment, something you have shared widely or not at all, recent or in the distant past. Please let me know if something comes to mind so I can slot it into one of our worship services in June. (You can even let me know on a Sunday before worship.)

As I mentioned in last week's Bulletinspeaking of prayer **don't forget about:**

- the Welcome Sheets,
- joining our Sunday Prayers roster,
- our prayer chain,
- being available to pray after the sermon on a Sunday morning,

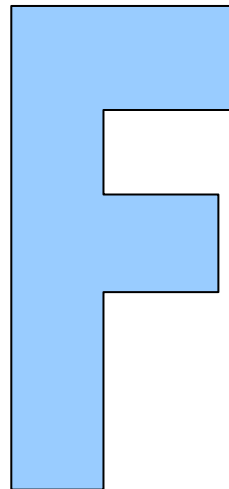
WOMEN'S RETREAT

KIDS AT HEART

Mark 10: 14... "Let the little children come to me"

Every week (except for School Sundays) we have a quiet craft activity for the children- held during Pastor's message. Today's craft will be led by Megan (Ahrens).

In the interest of expanding our children's ministry program, the Kids at Heart team now also have a special time for our little ones: "*Kids at Heart time*". The Goal is to Share the love of Jesus with songs, stories, games and more! On communion Sunday's, after they have taken communion or received a blessing, the children and helpers move to the GGOSH room for MORE FUN! The next "Kids at heart time(s)" will be held on 13 June and it will be led by Leanne (Solomou) and the theme will be Sampson and Goliath.

At "Kids at heart time", we use familiar children's bible stories/themes, as a basis for our activities. Last Sunday, Jane (Swansson) read the story: "Jonah and the whale". It was an opportunity to talk about prayer. Prayer in times of need, prayer for reflection on what we have done, prayer for help, support or guidance. Prayer can be to ask for God's forgiveness and to talk about what we will do better next time.

Some further questions for the older children, or for discussion at home:

- Why do you think Jonah ran away?
- Why do you think Jonah got angry?
- How did God feel about what the people in Nineveh were doing?
- What do you think Jonah should do next? (After the whale spits him out on the beach).
