Pastor's Column

We welcome Travis & Vikki Klose and their family and friends joining us for **Jasper Alex Klose's Baptism** this morning.

Today we commence the 4th part of our series: **Grow in faith** and we'll be considering growing in faith **in the world**. We are having a look at a few Bible verses: Matthew 5:13-16, Romans 5: 3 -5 and 1 Peter 3:15. We'll consider how the world provides *darkness* for us to shine, *heat* for us to be refined and *silence* for us to speak God's Word in faith.

This morning we also install a new staff position, the **Communication's Officer**. As was announced about a month ago Brian Quick has accepted our call. Brian has been working in this position for the last 3 weeks and now we are installing him: recognizing the position, praying for him, asking God's blessing upon his ministry and pledging our support for his work. I will briefly describe his role in the service but if you would like to know more about what he has been employed to do, his vision for the role and what he has been doing so far speak to Brian yourself.

Wasn't the **Prayer Vigil** yesterday wonderful? I am sure that this will invigorate the *Life of the congregation* and we shall see the fruits of this in our congregation. Please continue praying for the congregation – why not use the "**Prayer Vigil Resources**" that were made available for yesterday's event. Even if you couldn't make it yesterday it still is important to be part of the prayer and life of our congregation.

Last week we launched our **Day Pay Challenge.** Please see some of the points that I made elsewhere in this Bulletin.

This morning: Fellowship Groups leaders meeting: The main part of the meeting will be focused on **Connect.** Daryl is looking for support and assistance from the Fellowship Groups for the up-coming Fishing Fete. If you personally can't make it to the meeting this morning please arrange a representative from your Fellowship Group.

Next Sunday our worship will incorporate the Ardtornish District Scout Church Parade. We are expecting about a hundred visitors including many dignitaries for this special service. We would like to put on a special morning tea for our visitors. Could you please bring a plate of morning tea to share? Also if you are an ex-scout please wear your scout scarf on the day.

Every now and then I borrow **some current DVDs** from the local video shop and recently I borrowed four which I can highly recommend to you- to use in a Fellowship Group and as a means of talking about Christian themes with un-churched people.

Here are some points I made in regard to the **DAY PAY CHALLENGE**

- It is good habit to weekly giving to God (to tithe) as a constant way of saying thanks to God, like saying grace before a meal, but every so often we need to express our gratitude in a more substantial way and that is what *Day's Pay Challenge* is all about.
- Simply the Day's Pay Challenge is to give how much you earn in one day. One way of calculating this is by talking your annual salary (either gross or net) and dividing it by 200. Of course if your work is sporadic or part time or casual it is a bit more complicated. But the 200 rule on gross makes it simple. So if you earn \$30,000 a year, it would be \$150; \$50,000 it would be \$250; for "the average Australian pay" of \$67, 070 it would be about \$335. If you receive the single aged pension it would be about \$45; if you work in a café, for \$890 a week it would be about \$110; if you receive \$10 pocket money a week it would be \$2.
- Please use the envelopes marked *Servant September Day Pay Donation* and place it in the offering plate by 29th August in 6 week's time. If you want to do it through REG, just put a note in the envelope indicating this.
- This is your challenge. It is between you and God- an expression of thanks to God and it's a means to give a boost to our congregation.
