

TWO MINUTES

Matthew 3: 13-17 records the Baptism of Jesus. It's pretty obvious why Christians seek baptism – we're sinful and need God's forgiveness. But in these verses we read of Jesus' baptism – Jesus who is sinless and who does not require forgiveness!

So why was Jesus baptised? The NIV study Bible gives these reasons for Jesus' baptism:

- 1. 'to fulfil all righteousness' or, in other words, to fulfil the requirements of the law
- 2. to publically announce the arrival of the Messiah (and the voice from heaven certainly did this)
- 3. to completely identify with man's sin and failure and so becoming our substitute, our perfect sacrifice to be an example to us.

In Matthew 3 the baptism of Jesus marks the beginning of Jesus' ministry. In our baptism we celebrate the beginning of life in Christ. Praise God for giving us this everlasting life!

Dear Father in heaven,

We thank you for our baptism. Remind us that we are forgiven and made new through your grace. Help us to live our lives as your chosen people. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Pastor's Column

Welcome to our **Baptism Anniversary Service**, especially if you are here because of a personal invitation.

We are so glad you could make it this morning to: remember that you are God's child through baptism, to celebrate what this means, and worship and fellowship with other members of God's family. We have set aside a special part of the worship this morning for you to light your baptismal candle, receive a word of encouragement and a blessing as well as a memento of the occasion.

Anyone in the congregation this morning can be involved in this rite (if you are baptized). Spare baptism candles will available for this purpose for those of us who didn't bring our baptismal candle.

I hope you can stay for a special morning tea after this morning's worship.

I find it interesting that we see things from different perspectives. This morning we are going to have a closer look at the first reading for today, in particular Verse 15-17 (of Isaiah 65):

"See, I will create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered, nor will they come to mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in what I will create, for I will create Jerusalem to be a delight and its people a joy. I will rejoice over Jerusalem and take delight in my people; the sound of weeping and of crying will be heard in it no more.

We shall be considering the theme: A different view (now that you are baptized). I believe that since God is the Creator and so is in control and this gives us hope and drenches us with joy. As baptized people of God I reckon he gives you this view too.

Don't forget about our **School/Church Picnic next Sunday**. I hope you can make it.

Another aspect of being baptized is that our response is to: **Care, Communicate and Connect so that people know Christ**: our vision in our congregation.

Speaking of baptism:

- we show our *care* through being "support" people to the families who have wished to have their child baptized and are not members of our congregation. (Thank you for inviting the family you support along this morning.)
- We communicate not only through our invitations but by whenever we show God's love through who we are: what we do as well as what we say.
- We see connecting as an important part of our congregation because we have a diverse range of interest in our congregation (from Asaroka to GGAF including Mainly Music and Christmas Eve Drama) and we feel that being connected will strengthen the family we call GGLF but will also deepen our relationship with God because connecting itself is an expression of love. A young family from our congregation, living at Golden Grove, are looking for a nanny for their three children, ages 6, 3 and 2.
