**TWO MINUTES**

**Mark 6:30-34, 53-56** <sup>32</sup>So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place. <sup>33</sup>But many who saw them leaving recognized them and ran on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them. <sup>34</sup>When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began teaching them many things.

I love the passion that the followers of Jesus had in this passage. The disciples had spent a long day teaching all the people who were there. They did not have any time to rest or eat, because there were so many people willing to listen and learn about all what they had to teach. When the people listening saw they were leaving, they did not just sit back and say 'we have learnt all that we need to for now, we will leave them go and continue with our daily routine.' They did not just continue with the day trying to catch up on all the things that they did not get to do, trying desperately to catch up on the things missed out on for the day. Instead they continued to follow Jesus, they desired to learn more, they were not worried about all the things they needed to do, they were not interested in going back to their normal routine. They even "ran on foot" to get there before them.

So often I come to church on a Sunday (especially when I have an assignment due), arriving just before the service starts and leaving as soon as it is done. Or if my assignment is late, I do not come at all. It is as if this one hour out of my time will cause me to fail the assignment, even though, I usually waste more time than that on the internet while trying to complete it. If something else is happening on the weekend I do not make an effort to get to church with the thought, 'I will just go next week.' Sometimes I forget that by going to Church I am hearing the word of God, I am listening to him speaking to me personally. I should be passionate about hearing his word, I should desire to get to church early and learn from the other members of the congregation. Just because Jesus is not there in person does not mean that his word is any less valid in our lives. It can be difficult to remember the importance of hearing the word of God. But it is one of the most wonderful things that could happen to us in the week!

"Dear Lord, Please help us to be passionate and motivated to hear your word each week. Even when life is busy and it seems like we don't have time. Help us to remember that nothing is as important as you and there is no excuse not to spend most of our lives hearing and teaching your word. Amen"
