



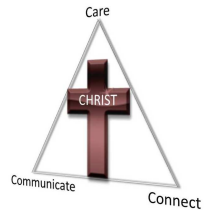

### TWO MINUTES

Hebrews 7 v 23-28

# Pastor's Column

Welcome to worship today. This morning **Pastor Len** is leading the service and this evening at Salt Factory, **Brian Quick** is speaking.

As you are no doubt aware, we are holding our **congregational camp this weekend at Walker's Flat (run by GGAF)**. If you didn't come this year there is always next. I hope you will join us then. It's a great opportunity to have fellowship, relax and even a drop a line in.

**Next Sunday** we are celebrating the baptisms that we have been blessed with over the last 12 months. This **Baptismal Celebration Service** will have the same features of last year's celebration, although it is only centred on those 24 people who have been baptized in that time. (See the baptism photo board for who they are.) What I mean centred is that their names will be read out, they will be invited to come forward to light their baptismal candle, receive a small gift from the congregation and a blessing. But there will also be opportunity for any one else in the congregation that day to light a baptismal candle and receive a special blessing as well. Also, we are providing a baptism celebration cake which will be cut for morning tea. **You are encouraged to bring morning tea to share so as to add to this celebration.**

Next Sunday we are also bringing the "**Day Pay Challenge**" to a close. If you don't know what the Day Pay Challenge is please see the article in this Bulletin.

In a couple weeks time we are celebrating a special **Asaroka service**: at Salt Factory on 8<sup>th</sup> November and in the morning service on 15<sup>th</sup> November. ## Day's Pay Challenge

*How can I repay the LORD for all his goodness to me? (Psalm 116:11)*

The answer is we can't. The Lord has done so much for us. But that is not to say we shouldn't express our thanks in extra-ordinary ways (beyond what we do each week in our weekly offering). The *Day's Pay Challenge* is just that opportunity.

As I said when we launched this Challenge on *Treasures Sunday* (20/9/09) it is also a way for our congregation to get rid of our deficit so that we can do some things that we have been putting on hold.

What is *Day Pay Challenge*? Simply the *Day's Pay Challenge* is giving how much you earn in one day. One way of calculating this is by taking your annual salary (either gross or net—you choose) and dividing it by 200. As I have said previously, of course if your work is sporadic or part time or casual it is a bit more complicated, but the 200 rule on gross makes it simple. So if you earn \$30,000 a year, it would be \$150, \$50,000 it would be \$250, \$80,000 it would be \$400. You work it out.

Please use the envelopes marked *Servant September Day Pay Donation* and place it in the offering plate by All Saints Day (1/11/09) which is in **2 week's time**. So you should be making your calculations and decisions soon.

If you want to do it through REG, please transfer your donation to LLL Account No. 28190/S1/GOL.

Just to remind you: one of our members is generously matching dollar for dollar, up to \$10,000.

This is your challenge. It is between you and God—a special expression of thanks to God and it's a means to give our congregation a boost.
